## Message from your Executive Board

## Eye-Catching Season of Art "VISIONS"

Second Show of the 2018 - 2019 Season  
Judge: Ralph Papa

### Congratulations to all!

This was the second judged show of the season. Artwork entered was created in Oil, Acrylic, Watercolor, Pastel, Collage and Photography. 22 artists were represented and a total of 41 pieces of art were exhibited. Ralph Papa, the judge had this to say:

**First Place** - "An outstanding work with great perspective and brilliant color. I particularly like the main and background figures in the scene; subtle real and moving like the waves breaking water."

**Second Place** - "The horse racing scene depicted in this painting is both complicated and difficult to capture. The artist did an amazing painting in water media. The crowd in the stands and the horses rounding the turn are beautifully defined."

**Third Place** - "An eye-catching beautiful painting that plays well with the lady in gray tones against a complimentary background of red and green."

**Honorable Mention** - "The rose with back light is just magnificent".

**Overall** - "Thank you for the honor of judging your November exhibition. It was a fine show with diverse styles and mediums. There were quite a few worthy artworks, so narrowing it down to four awards was quite a task".

YES! We will once again be holding an outdoor show in the parking lot on the east side of the gallery, during the Street Painting Festival weekend. This show is for member's only and will

be on a first come first serve basis. There is room for 6 tents and 6 tables. Sign-ups begin in December. There is no fee to show; as 20% of all sales will be retained by the LWAL.

Tents are recommended as the sun can be brutal. Any tent, canopy or large umbrella must be properly weighted to keep them from flying in case of windy weather, so please keep this in mind as you make your plans. Tents may be shared.

No parking will be available. You may drop off your tents/items the day before. Set up in the mornings must be complete before noon each day so the gallery can open. Arrange to be dropped off and picked up or you will have to park away from the gallery. Just a few spots available to those working the gallery that day.

We will also need a few extra folks to help out both days, as we usually get quite a crowd. Please consider volunteering for an extra shift, to help with guests, sales, or to assist the outdoor folks with a break, etc.

## GALLERY ARTISTS BOOK *Are you in it?*



We want all visitors to the gallery to know about you and your art.

We have placed an Artist's Eye Gallery Artists binder in the gallery. All artists are encouraged to submit a 8.5x11 page in the binder. It may be printed on two sides, or 2 sheets placed back to back as placed in a plastic sleeve in the binder.

PLEASE INCLUDE your name, and your artist's statement and, if you so desire, a photo of yourself and/or photos of some of your artwork printed on the page. You may also include any awards if you like. DO NOT include your contact information, or any business name.

Please leave at least 3/4" on the left side of the page, as it will be three hole punched. Sheets will be placed alphabetically by last name.

This binder will help advertise you to gallery visitors. The binder can be shown to prospective buyers who may show an interest in a specific work, giving them access to more information about the artist they are interested in. The book also serves as a tool for the Artist's in Residence (a.k.a. gallery sitters) to use. We encourage those who have free time while tending to the gallery to read about and familiarize themselves with their fellow artists and their work. Please drop off as soon as possible so we can get it out there!
