What We OUGHT to be About

Musings on Retirees

As a retiree who now serves on the Board of Directors of RC 7, I would like to share some thoughts with you. Feel free to pass this information on to others!

Our Retiree Structure (YAWN...)

- We have 600,000 + members throughout NYS (and Florida).
- The NYSUT Board of Directors has three Retiree Reps from across the state who are elected every three years. Our rep is Loretta Donlon.
- Retirees are divided into Election Districts (EDs) of their locals based on geography and are called Retiree Councils (RCs). We are RC 7 which includes retirees from locals in Onondaga and Cayuga Counties.
- Each RC elects its own officers. Our current president is Loretta Donlon.

Loretta does a great job as both a member of the Board of Directors for ED 51 and head of RC 7. However, the jobs are separate and distinct and could be held by two different people.

Maybe We Get Tired, But We're Tough!

At 600,000+ Strong, We Don't Realize Our Power! Ninety (90) percent of NYSUT Retirees are registered to vote. That's huge, when compared with the general population in which less than one third are even registered.

And, our retirees VOTE in far greater proportion than the general population.

Data from 2014 indicates that 66% of public employees (including NYSUT members) supported union-backed candidates, compared with 32% supported by the general population. (Peter Hart Associates)

Conclusion: We have power when we use it collectively.

Consider These Thoughts

There are "double barrel" issues (my name for them) that are important to both retirees and inservice folks. Those issues are the social safety net issues of pensions, social security, and health care. (PLUS we need to add affordable child care and affordable college!) We KNOW these issues, we CARE about these issues and they're IMPORTANT to everyone!

The Ed Reform battle may best be left to the inservice folks who live it daily and understand it, but retirees can certainly focus on the double barrel issues.

We were fortunate to inherit a social safety net from our parents. It falls to us to protect and enhance it and assure that our kids inherit a social safety net from us. That's the whole reason the retirees unit exists, i.e. to protect the benefits that we fought for and earned.

A Glimpse at the NYSUT RA

This past month you were represented at the NYSUT Representative Assembly, the RA for short, by the delegates you elected - Marjory Schuster, Sylvia Matousek, Margo Buckingham and me. We went to Rochester to decide what policies NYSUT would pursue in the next year. As you remember, the RA is the policing making body of the union. Locals prepare resolutions seeking action on issues important to in-service members as well as retirees. Committees at the RA review them and recommend them for passage or not. I think you, as a retiree, will be happy that resolutions to protect Social Security, Medicare, and several others urging our national affiliates to strengthen their pressure on Congress to keep these staples of a good retirement from falling victim to those groups calling them entitlements rather than our earned benefits, were passed.

The RA as a whole is a time to renew our energy to keep our union strong and to see we are not alone in that work. This year, President Karen Magee stressed three main points to remember as the delegates return to their locals: Educate, Motivate and Activate.

Our retired members are the first group to Educate on the issues like the disaster that could befall the state if a Constitutional Convention is approved in 2017 or the others aimed at making school districts and locals weaker that we read about all too often.

Our job as returning delegates is to Motivate all of you to take action in our own defense. We ask you to spread the word and Activate others. Including the community will give us more pressure to resolve the many attacks that we have felt in recent years.

While addressing the members of ED 51, I said I would add one more word to the three directives of the RA and that word is **VOTE**. That is how our power can and will be felt. NYSUT is introducing a new campaign "Pledge to Vote". Research has proven that IF A PERSON MAKES A FORMAL CONMMITTMENT TO DO SOMETHING, THEY ARE FAR MORE LIKELY TO FOLLOW THROUGH ON THAT COMMITTMENT. I hope you will take action right away. Encourage your children and grandchildren who are not yet registered to vote to do so, then "Pledge to Vote", as well.

NYSUT has set a goal of signing up 95% of its members in this "Pledge to Vote" Campaign. Volunteers will ask members to sign pledge post cards or to sign the pledge at pledge.nysut.org.

Can you be an educated, motivated and activated retiree and sign on to the "Pledge to Vote" Campaign even before you are asked? RC 7's delegates and Executive Board have signed on - NOW IT'S YOUR TURN!


