
### Message from the Commander of Kadosh





Dear Brethren of the Valley of El Paso:

It is an honor to have been elected Commander of Kadosh this year. But this year has also been a year of great sadness for all of us because of the terrible pandemic we are living through.



#### VALLEY NEWS

#### From the Secretary's Office

#### Brethren:

In coping with the continuing COVID-19 Pandemic, the Valley of El Paso continues to follow the Proclamations and Directives of the Grand Master of Texas and the Sovereign Grand Inspector General of Texas, both of whom remind

us that all State, City and County Directives must also be followed.

By order of the Sovereign Grand Inspector General (SGIG), the Valley of El Paso has been authorized to resume our Stated Meetings on November 9, 2020, barring any unforeseen circumstances. We will have to adhere to certain conditions; masks must be worn at <u>ALL</u> times while in the building, temperature checks and wellness screenings are required upon entering the building, hand sanitizer must be available, social distancing must be kept at all times (minimum of six feet), and until further notice no food or meals in any form are to be prepared, served or eaten in the building. All meeting spaces must be cleaned and sanitized after each use.

This directive applies to all Scottish Rite activities including Clubs, Degree Teams, Committees, Social Groups, etc. Unfortunately, the Scottish Rite Convocation scheduled for September 12, 2020 in Waco has been canceled. The Feast of Tishri scheduled for October 16, 2020 has also been canceled. Our buildings are still to remain **closed to the general public** until further notice.

All Reunions and reunion-related activities scheduled to be held in the Orient of Texas are **canceled for 2020**. The Valleys in the Orient of Texas are authorized to proceed in the planning for the **2021 Spring Reunion**. It has been suggested that the Valleys conduct a One-Day Reunion with the five (5) terminal degrees and it has been recommended that we consider conferring the Degrees in tuxedo or dark suit instead of costume as a sanitation precaution. The restriction against recruiting has been lifted, we encourage you to start approaching potential candidates at this time. A date for the 2021 Spring Reunion will be announced later on in the year.

Having said all that, you may get the impression that we are closed down for business. Nothing could be farther from the truth. The Scottish Rite Office staff continue with the day-to-day operation of your Valley. The phone doesn't ring as much and we miss the personal visits but the administration of the daily business hasn't changed.

Chairman Tom Higgins and myself have had regular "virtual" meetings with the SGIG and the Orient Executive Committee on webbased meeting platforms. The business of the Orient of Texas is being well attended to. The Valley Finance Committee is in regular communication with our Financial Advisor and we continue to monitor our financial portfolio during this ever changing market. The Foundation Board of Director's are kept attuned to all matters concerning the Temple Building. Rest assured that when we are able to return to our regular labors that nothing went neglected other than our ability to gather in person for fellowship and normal activities

Please stop and take the time to call your friends and any members you haven't heard from for a while and make sure they are OK. If you, or anyone you know, is in distress or in need of assistance during this challenging time, please let us know. Stay safe!!!

#### **2020 Dues**
