



Rainbows to Clouds: How Do You Feel?

Discuss: What do you think makes a rainbow grow? When you see a rainbow how do you feel?

Now it is your turn! Color in your own rainbow! What does it look like when you see one? [Hint: Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo, Violet]



Some days are cloudy, and clouds can grow and can have different colors. Discuss: How do you feel when clouds cover up a sunny day and get big and bigger?

Now it is your turn! Can you color these clouds to have some of them grey and some of them a darker grey?
