May Presenter: Robin Long

Monday, May 24 Zoom Lecture: "Modern Mariner's Compass – Strip Pieced!"

What started as a quest to make a Mariner's Compass quilt for her submarine officer husband, Robin Long took an idea she had in 1992 and launched Robin Ruth Design in January, 2015. She has developed a new line of revolutionary rulers, books, patterns and technique for making STRIP-PIECED mariner's compass blocks in16 sizes – that's right, NO PAPER PIECING!

This system of rulers begins with the Skinny Robin 16-Point and Fat Robin 16-Point Mariner's Compass Book and Ruler combos; each used to create slightly different mariner's compass blocks in 16 sizes (from 6"-36") using the exact same process. This revolutionary strippiecing method enables you to make the once tedious and unapproachable mariner's compass block quickly and accurately. 

Lighthouse Quilters Guild Guild Meeting March 29, 2021 Zoom Virtual Meeting

The Guild welcomed 74 participants to Karen Miller's "AURiphilosophy" lecture and trunk show. We had several members from Wandering Foot and Crazy Quilter's join us for the presentation. Karen explained the origins of Aurifil threads and described uses for threads of various weights (12, 28, 40, 50 and 80). Because threads of lower weights are thicker, they require needles with higher numbers. Pat Henningfeld alerted Guild members that we will need to discuss the 2022 Quilt Show. 
