



Guest Speaker September 26, 2022



The program by Bloomington, Indiana author and artist, Joe Lee, will be inspirational. In an article which appeared in *The Herald Times* in October 2021, Lee was intentional about the purpose of his book. Although Kor's story, as well as those of other Holocaust survivors, has been told numerous times before in books and films, Lee hopes his graphic novel will reach a younger audience of high school and possibly junior high students. He was also "careful to ensure it's Eva Kor's voice that's heard throughout." "It's Eva's story," he said. "It's not a story I wanted to edi-

torialize." That point is even more important since Kor is no longer here to tell her own story. In July 2019, Lee was part of a small group that traveled to Poland to visit Auschwitz II-Birkenau with Kor. She had led such trips for years, sharing details of her life in the concentration camp as well as her eventual public forgiveness of the people who killed her family and held her and her sister captive. Lee's participation in the tour was due in large part to his wife, Bess, who advised him not to delay. Why was Lee drawn (sorry for the unintentional pun) to this special story? Find out more by attending the September dinner!

WW 2 TRIVIA FOR SEPTEMBER 2022

Inspired by Ozzie's earlier trivia reports . . .

September 1, 1939 Germany invades Poland, initiating World War II in Europe. September 3, 1939 Honoring their guarantee of Poland's borders, Great Britain and France declare war on Germany. September 17, 1939 The Soviet Union invades Poland from the east.

September 2, 1945. Japan surrenders and WWII ends. Japanese forces holding out in the mountains ٠ of the island of Luzon in the Philippines had lost all of their communication equipment and were not able to receive orders from Japanese military commands. When Japan surrendered in September 1945, notice of the surrender was delivered to them by balloon (Source: "Encyclopedia Britannica, 1945") Note: Hiroo Onoda (19 March 1922 – 16 January 2014) was an Imperial Japanese Army intelligence officer who fought in World War II and was one of two Japanese holdouts who did not surrender at the war's end in August 1945. After the war ended, Onoda spent 29 years hiding in the Philippines until his former commander travelled from Japan to formally relieve him from duty by order of Emperor Showa in 1974. (Wikipedia)

[An original example of "fake news"?] Mr Onoda and his colleagues dismissed the leaflets, which detailed the Japanese sur-



render, as fake. The foursome survived by eating dried banana skins, coconuts and stolen rice, and Mr Onoda shot cows to make dried beef on occasion too. The group heard planes flying overhead during the Korean war in the early Fifties, and assumed they were some form of Japanese counter-offensive. Mr Onoda recalled in his memoir that he and comrade Kinshichi Kozuka had "developed so many fixed ideas that we were unable to understand anything that did not conform to them".

- September 4, 1941: USS Greer [find my photo] becomes the first United States warship fired upon by a German U-boat in the war, even though the United States is a neutral power. Tension heightens between the two nations as a result. The U.S. is now committed to convoy duties between the Western Hemisphere and Europe. On September 11, 1941 FDR orders the United States Navy to shoot on sight if any ship or convoy is threatened.
- September 10, 1941: German armies now have Kiev completely surrounded. This encirclement is considered the largest in the history of warfare (by number of troops). The operation ran from 7 August to 26 September 1941, as part of Operation Barbarossa, the Axis invasion of the Soviet Union. [Ed: Kiev has had centuries of struggle against invading threats and Russian aggression in 2022 is not new, but it is worrisome news.]
- ٠ In 1942, September 9, The first of the two Lookout Air Raids occurred in Oregon. A Japanese Yokosuka E14Y floatplane launched from a submarine dropped two incendiary bombs with the intention of starting a forest fire. The damage done was minor, however. A year later,




 September 8, 1943: Marshal Pietro Badoglio announces the surrender of Italy to the Allies, orders Italian forces to "cease all acts of hostility against the Anglo-American forces wherever they may be met"

Lt. Colonel John William Brill USAF passed away peacefully in Noblesville on August 19, 2022. John served as a jet-fighter interceptor squadron commander during the Korean and cold war era, beginning in 1952 at Otis USAF base followed by 15 years of active reserve duty based in Baer Field, Indiana. He piloted the following military aircraft: F-861, F-94C, F-80, F-84F, B-25, along with many civilian aircraft.
