

<u>Jesus Calling Cadence for</u> <u>Community</u> <u>With Pastor Eric</u>

By day the LORD commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life. Psalm 42:8

When I was in the military, the most consistent and vivid memories I have involve marching and running everywhere. We lived in units of people who lived together, ate together, trained together, exercised together – you get the picture. The goal was unit cohesion to live and fight as one body. There is strength and power in numbers working together towards a common goal with shared values. We were only as strong as the weakest members, and when one person hurt then everyone felt it, and when one person excelled then everyone benefited.

I suggest that the baseline for building this type of community is the "cadence call".

The cadence call is a rhythmic series of vocal phrases which someone says to keep people marching or running (*moving*) in unison. Like our psalms on Sunday, many of these practices involved responses and an on-going dialog within the unit. With the cadence call, we would speak as one voice either announcing our presence, encouraging one another onward, or re-enforcing our identity. The cadence call caused amazing things to happen as well. We could run or march faster and farther then we thought possible while maintaining unity and fighting strength. The key was doing it often and consistently.

The church has a cadence call of its own. This cadence begins with the church calendar which starts in Advent and moves with a rhythm through Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, Pentecost, and Ordinary Time (*time of growth*). Within this yearly seasonal rhythm are weekly gatherings for worship on Sundays in which we have the liturgy (literally "the people's work together" worship). Every Sunday in worship we hear and feel the rhythm of "Gathering, Word, Meal, Sending" and we expect them because they form the pattern and inner rhythm of our daily life together – even when we are physically apart! The key to our unity is Christ Jesus whose Spirit gathers us together, enlightens us, and sets us apart for God's loving purposes. However, like the military cadence, the nature of repetition, continuity and consistency are a factor in the strength, and effectiveness of the congregation and it's work together. The more we worship together, and fellowship together, pray with/for each other, the more we live for each other – not as an act of will but out of a natural compulsion of loving care and compassion with Jesus.

As we enter the Lenten season, I invite you to consider the cadence calls or rhythms of daily life that connect you with God and your congregational family.

Let us pray. Gracious God, whose Spirit resonates with the rhythms of life, keep us close to your heart always so that we might live into the cadence call of your love and purposes. Help us to connect with those around us who share in that call to grow in strength, fellowship, and unity in Jesus's name we pray. Amen.

We wait, sometimes for years, for our prayers to be answered, for our deepest longings to be fulfilled. Some devoted Christians get stuck in dead-end jobs even though they feel certain they could serve God in greater ways if only He would open the opportunity. Why doesn't He? Some wait for a godly spouse, some couples wait for the gift of children, and some, who have dedicated their lives to serving the Lord, wait in disappointed bafflement as their work seems to yield no fruit. Why?

As Christians, we yearn to serve the Lord, to step forward and obey Him like the great heroes of the Bible, but we are confused, waiting for clear orders, kept at a distance by the invisible barriers of God's silence, His inaction, or His unhurried pace. In "When God Takes Too Long", Joseph Bentz examines the mysteries of God's timing and shows Christians how to thrive in the midst of one of life's greatest frustrations--waiting. He offers those who have been discouraged by a life of waiting a chance to alter not only their perspective on waiting, but also their actions in response to it, transforming this frustration into a positive force that will enrich and change their lives.

"When God Takes Too Long" addresses:

- How not to wish (or wait) our lives away
- How to better understand the nature of time
- How to master the discipline of waiting
- How to cast off the boundaries of time to view our lives from an eternal perspective
