Desert Gold

For countless centuries, gold has lead a small but determined segment of mankind to the ends of the earth. People have put up with the harshest conditions imaginable for the slim chance of striking it rich. When specialized equipment was required. someone eventually found the means to extract the precious yellow metal. Placer gold deposits, or gold that has been weathered out of hard-rock veins by the relentless pressure of wind or water, was probably the first to be exploited by early miners. Recovering gold in some places was relatively easy. Abundant water could be used to facilitate the separation of gold from other materials. The specific gravity of gold is about 19 times that of water and about twice that of lead. Panning off the lighter over burden is a simple and elegant solution to the problem of concentrating placer gold. A sluicebox is nothing more then a small section of man made river that mimics the gold concentrating aspects of natural flowing water. The key has always been water. An adequate supply of water ensured relatively easy placer gold retrieval. Little or no water made placer gold much more difficult. Mineralized areas in the desert section of the earth are not extremely hard to spot. The first desert prospectors used little more than a well-trained eye to locate and exploit dry gold placers. These men were looking for what we now refer to as "float gold." Float is quartz rock that has weathered out of surface veins. This material lies close to the original source and is highly visible. Quartz rocks and boulders appear to "float" on the surrounding ground. Gold is often associated with quartz float in gold producing regions. Flat may cover quite large areas, or it may be contained in a small spot referred to as a quartz blowout. This

name is aptly descriptive of the visual effect of the quartz. The presence of float gold indicates that the lode (hard-rock vein) is at hand. Although the float might be very rich, it was usually the lode gold that was the object of the search.

Once the float and particles of gold are moved away from the float area through weathering, they tend to sink into the surrounding overburden. If no water was available, the only alternative the ancients had for retrieving the placer gold was to use techniques known today as dry panning and winnowing.

Gold is so heavy that it will drop to the bottom of the pan of pay-dirt with prolonged, vigorous shaking, even without the help of water. Once the material has been thoroughly shaken, the top layer of dirt and the larger rocks are removed from the pan. More pay-dirt is then added and the process is repeated. After a while, the bottom of the material in the pan will hopefully become concentrated with gold. Dry panning is highly efficient. Small flakes of gold that are trapped in dirt clods will not drop to the bottom of the pan because the overall weight of the clod is fairly light. Much time has been spent in breaking up the material to be panned, but reasonable quantities of placer gold can be taken from very rich locations in this fashion. Precious water is only used on the final gold separation.

Gold winnowing is the process of throwing a mixed gravel aggregate into the air and allowing the wind to blow off the lighter materials. In windy conditions it was possible to remove significant amounts of gold

from the richer hillsides and washes by this process. A large flat basket or a blanket was used to toss paydirt into the air. The lighter material was simply blown away, thus concentrating the heavy materials. It was possible to work larger quantities of material than dry panning, but the process was still inefficient.

The washes were dug to the pay layers or to the bedrock. Deposits of fine gold we would delight in were missed or simply rejected as being low grade. Without adequate water, dry placer gold was difficult to retrieve, but it was possible. The trick was to concentrate the pay-dirt to the point that scarce water could be used for the final separation.


Wind could be used to replace water, but unfortunately the wind does not blow everyday. At some point around the turn of the last century, the mechanical drywasher evolved from the process of dry panning and gold winnowing. As far as I can determine, by the early 1900's a mechanical gold winnower had been tested in Australia.

Old-timers have told me that by the early 1920s there were prospectors using bellows drywashers in the Imperial Valley of California and the rich Laguna placers near Yuma, Arizona. With this type of machine it became possible for one person to separate out fine gold from the dry placer deposits surrounding hardrock locations.

Now a single miner could process very large amounts of pay-dirt and end up with a very small amount of concentrates. 1000 lbs. of gold-bearing gravels could be reduced to less than 20 lb. of concentrates. At that point water could be expended on the final separation. Many abandoned placers could be worked

profitably by a few determined individuals, and today some recreational miners are doing exactly that in the desert locations of the USA, Mexico and many other countries throughout the world. The first attempts at a constant air machine were also made

in the



predecessors to the vibrostatic machines of today. The older constant air drywashers used a squirrel cage blower to supply air, but they did not have a weighted fan for vibration. The constant air, electrostatic, or vibrostatic machines are one class of drywasher, while all of the bellows machines are the other.

Wet and dry placers do share common characteristics, but in some ways, they are very different. Some of the equipment used in dry conditions has no utility in wet placers and vice versa. Understanding how dry placer equipment works and knowing about the different types of equipment available will save a great deal of time and effort in selecting equipment that will fit your needs. How gold is moved and deposited in the desert can be quite different from the commonly held ideas as to how placer deposits work on rivers. Understanding something about the similarities and differences will greatly enhance learning to work the desert.





Questions? & Answers!

Question: I have a standard 8.5 inch coil. I am planning to get a bigger 12.5 inch coil. What would be the deference?

Answer: Advantages: 1- With a bigger coil you will save some time because you are sweeping a larger area. 2- For bigger targets only, Depth would be improved by up to 20%. Disadvantages: 1-With a bigger, coil you might miss some small targets like nuggets etc. 2- Pinpointing will be more difficult. 3- If you are using a target I.D. Accuracy will be less. 4- In trashy areas, you might have several targets under the coil. This might confuse your detector.

Question: I want to get a smaller 4 to 5 inch coil for my unit. What difference would it make?

Answer: Advantages: 1-Smaller coils are good for trashy areas. 2-For smaller targets like Gold nuggets, smaller coil is better. 3-You can get into between Rocks and other 'Hard to get places'. Disadvantages:: 1-You will spend more time because your sweeping area is smaller. 2-Detection depth can decrease for bigger targets.

Question: I got a 'Hot Coil' for my detector, Mail Order Dealer claimed that I will achieve a better depth. When I put it on my detector, I did not see any difference. Why?

Answer: So Called "Hot Coils" have no secrets (If they were better, manufacturer itself would have built them). Not only they will not go deeper than standard factory coil but also are less wa-

ter resistance. Remember, nothing is as good as the manufacturers' brand coil for your detectors.

Question: I am confused with detector Comparison Charts, My Garrett CX model can be converted to Two-Box machine using a Depth-Multiplier. This is not listed there. Why?

Answer: Detector "Comparison Charts" are "paid charts" by certain dealers, manufacturers and magazines. They are full of errors and misleading information. Garrett, and Tesoro detectors have much more features than what you will find on those charts. If you are really interested in the facts, Please check the manufacturers Comparison Charts not "the fake ones". For Fisher and Garrett check their last page of the Catalogs.

Question: I bought my detector based on the article I read in a treasure magazine (from another dealer at full price). But now, I am very unhappy about it. How could it happen? I mean the article?

Answer: Unfortunately, some articles in treasure magazines are paid by certain Manufacturers or dealers. It is sad that you lost the money you paid for the detector and the one that you paid for the magazine as well. However, there are some magazines that are mostly based on research and articles written by people in hobby for year, I can name "lost treasures" to be one the good ones.

Question: I heard of ROM Card locators' and 'Long range locators' that can detect treasure with different Antennas. Do they really work?

Answer: They will work for the (Continued on page 8)

dealers to make \$\$ but not for you to locate treasures. After purchasing them, you will find this sentence on their warranty card; "If you open the box the warranty will expire", just because they know than nothing is inside but a few capacitors or resistors to fool the people. When you want to return it, they will say; "There is a 20% re-stocking fee". Secondly, You will never be able to locate their manufacturer, there is no address written on the warranty cards, except the dealer's address. You will not even know, if they are made in U.S.A. or China or Canada. That is how their 'business' work.

Question: What is the deference between low and high frequency in Gold detectors?

Answer: Gold nugget detectors usually operate in between 17:w kHz to 71 kHz range. Many people think that the higher frequency is better to have. But it all depends on the soil conditions. Fist of all, we can change a frequency of a gold detector from (for example) 18 kHz to 90 kHz by changing a Crystal or a Capacitor or an inductor. This can cost less than \$1 worth of components. I personally like 17 to 20 kHz range detectors for Gold nuggets. Because, If we go higher than that machine would be so sensitive that will die in black sand. Dealers, usually like to sell 40-71 kHz detectors because they show a very good air test. On my opinion, Air tests are the worst way of showing the performance of a detector especially if the detector is a gold detector, because a good gold de-

tector is for black sand conditions (not air) to operate. If detector is in 50 or higher frequency range, Signal will bounce easily by black sand, because sensitivity is high and machine thinks of black sand as small nuggets. Here is the catch. It is easy to build a detector in any frequency we wish, but it is very hard to control the effect of minerals in higher range, unless our design has some filters or circuits that can eliminate black sand and mineral response. High freq. cannot go deep because of minerals in the soil(signal will be reflected)therefore we will miss big nuggets but in exchange we will get small nuggets just on the surface. If you are money wise, then, you like the big nuggets, not the tiny ones. With high freq. you will loose depth in mineralized soil, and you will sweep over many nuggets without detecting them. Think of high and low freq. as 'light' and 'radio'. light is high freq. Radio waves are low freq. (with respect to light). Light cannot pass though most objects and reach the target, but you can still listen to radio in a submarine. That is the deference. It is not iron itself but the oxides like Fe2O3 or Fe3O4 that help the signal to boost. You have heard from magazines that if treasure is buried for long time, it can be detected easier. This statement is right and wrong. If the treasure is IRON, then it is right because Iron Oxides will be released and the target will look bigger for the Detector, but if Treasure is Gold, (Gold does not have any oxides) even if it is buried for a million year, the detection depth will not improve a single inch.






