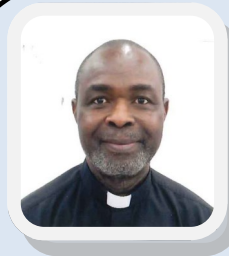

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Our Vocation of Beatitude §1725-1729

IN BRIEF

1725 The Beatitudes take up and fulfill God's promises from Abraham on, by ordering them to the Kingdom of heaven. They respond to the desire for happiness that God has placed in the human heart.

1726 The Beatitudes teach us the final end to which God calls us: the Kingdom, the vision of God, participation in the divine nature, eternal life, filiation, rest in God.

1727 The beatitude of eternal life is a gratuitous gift of God. It is supernatural, as is the grace that leads us there.

1728 The Beatitudes confront us with decisive choices concerning earthly goods; they purify our hearts in order to teach us to love God above all things.

1729 The beatitude of heaven sets the standards for discernment in the use of earthly goods in keeping with the law of God.

RESUMEN

1725 *Las bienaventuranzas recogen y perfeccionan las promesas de Dios desde Abraham ordenándolas al Reino de los cielos. Responden al deseo de felicidad que Dios ha puesto en el corazón del hombre.*

1726 *Las bienaventuranzas nos enseñan el fin último al que Dios nos llama: el Reino, la visión de Dios, la participación en la naturaleza divina, la vida eterna, la filiación, el descanso en Dios.*

1727 *La bienaventuranza de la vida eterna es un don gratuito de Dios; es sobrenatural como también lo es la gracia que conduce a ella.*

1728 *Las bienaventuranzas nos colocan ante opciones decisivas con respecto a los bienes terrenos; purifican nuestro corazón para enseñarnos a amar a Dios sobre todas las cosas.*

1729 *La bienaventuranza del cielo determina los criterios de discernimiento en el uso de los bienes terrenos en conformidad a la Ley de Dios.*

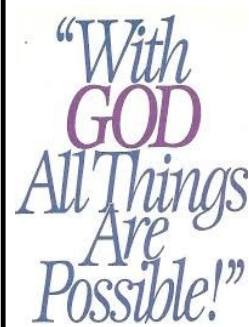
REMINDER MASS TIME CHANGE

ST. AGATHA February 5

Almost nothing is historically certain about this saint except that she was martyred in Sicily during the persecution of Emperor Decius in 251. She is claimed as the patroness of Catania where the year after her death, the stilling of an eruption of Mt. Etna was attributed to her intercession. As a result people continued to ask her prayers for protection against fire. Her veil is to this day displayed during Mt. Etna's eruptions. The scientific modern mind winces at the thought of a volcano's might being contained by God because of the prayers of a Sicilian girl. She is patroness of such varied professions as those of foundry workers, nurses, miners and Alpine guides and victims of breast cancer. Yet, in our historical precision, have we lost an essential human quality of wonder and poetry, and even our belief that we come to God by helping each other, both in action and prayer?
