Mike was a lifelong Manhattan area resident and business owner who dedicated himself to the community. He was a founding member of the IASCW in 1981 and one of the original founding organizers of the Manhattan Irish Fest. Each student will receive a \$1000 scholarship toward the school of his/her choice. The Manhattan Irish Fest has awarded \$27,000 in scholarships since 2004.
