A NOTE FROM PASTOR JIM

"What does this mean?" Are those words familiar to you? I bet they are, but if not, they ought to be. This question is asked by Martin Luther no fewer than 37 times in his Small Catechism. I mention this for several reasons.

First of all, as I write this, we were approaching reformation Sunday which commemorates the beginning of the Reformation. We celebrated the posting of the 95 Theses written by Luther in 1517. This was a tremendously important historical event. It set into motion a debate within the Christian Church (at least in Western Europe) which is still ongoing. A huge step toward reconciling differences came about 1999 with the issuing of the Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification by the Lutheran World Federation and the Vatican. However, we are still separated from the Roman Catholic Church in a number of ways.

Discussions between representatives of those two bodies continue on a national and international level. I try to stay abreast of these discussions because I have two mentors who participate in them. On November 7 the Metro NY Synod and the Archdiocese of New York are presenting a forum led by Eero Huovinen, the Lutheran Bishop Emeritus of Helsinki, Finland and Roman Catholic Bishop Christopher Kenney of England. They will be presenting the latest developments in these talks which are meant to bring the two churches closer together. I will be in attendance.

"What does this mean?" This is the question most often raised in their deliberations. As they two sides search for common ground between them, they try to understand how they each understand basic theological doctrines. They search for common ground by trying to understand how each side understands concepts like grace, faith, and justification, divine inspiration, the sacraments, and the priesthood. The goal is to come closer and closer together, and there is reason for us to hope that this will one day be achieved. The motivation of course is contained in the message of that well-known hymn, "The Church's One Foundation is Jesus Christ Our Lord"

I recently officiated at my first wedding. I worked with the young couple over the period of a year to help them understand *what it means* to be married in the church. In my sermon at the wedding ceremony I spoke about *what it means* to have the understanding that God is present in a marriage and that God *blesses* a marriage.

I have had the joy of baptizing two infants here in the Parish, and again, it was important for me to speak with the families about "what does this mean?". And of course, I have presided over several funerals and burials. I have spent many hours speaking with families, offering the comfort and consolation of Jesus' promise of eternal life for those who believe in Him. Not everyone gets married. Not everyone has children to be baptized. But everyone, sooner or later, faces the death of a loved one, and will also face the end of their own days on this earth.

"What does this mean?" I think it is very important to think theologically---to think about where God is in our lives, in the lives of those we meet, and in the events of the world. We are hosting an event at St. Paul's Parish Hall on Saturday, November 10 from 9:30 until 3 on this very question: "What does this mean?" It is a retreat led by Rev. Jonathan Linman who is Bishop Assistant in charge of faith and formation for the Metro NY Synod. We will be using Luther's Small Catechism as a vehicle to stimulate conversation about our faith in 2018. There will be participants (clergy and lay) from all of the Lutheran congregations that make up the Hudson Conference and it promises to be very rewarding. I hope to see you there.


