North Building Fire

On 4/10/18 in early afternoon, a North Building fire pull station alerted there was smoke and fire in the North Building elevator pit.

The alarm panels began alerting in quick succession to advise everyone that an event was in progress. As we have seen from experience, the alarm sensors are *thankfully* very sensitive and a vape e-cigarette, a saw used, or an open vacuum dust bin used without covering a sensor- can easily set them off- but in this case there was a presence of Fire and accompanying Smoke to be alerted to.

As everyone mobilized to come to our assistance, we confirmed the elevators and hallways were clear as black smoke rapidly filled the buildings middle 4th, 5th and 6th floor elevator landings and hallways.

The Fire Rescue trucks came racing to our fountain circle and drives to cordon off the roads, so they'd be clear for emergency work. The E.M.T.'s pulled in and began mobilizing as well.

As the hoses and axes rolled out the Fire Captains began planning the steps that would be taken after successful fire and smoke containment. The Office began calling all Residents, Owners and Guests to make certain all units were clear and all residing/sheltering inside had access to emergency resources should they need them.

Fire Emergency Response Teams assisted some Residents to waiting airconditioned lobbies, our Social Room or onto gurneys that could be rolled to the equipped buses they had efficiently mobilized onsite.

After clean-up and the building's release for re-occupancy, the cause of the below-stairs elevator pit fire was attributed to a bag of trash having caught on fire during installation welding. The installing techs ran down to apply the extinguisher due to the high flammability of the bag and wiring within, pulled the pull station and called 911 for further assistance.

We had the hallways, ceilings, carpets and lobbies inspected, a general cleaning was ordered, and General Elevator had the elevator pit and walls professionally cleaned to eliminate the smell emanating onto the floors.

To protect the new elevator components, the Association opened an insurance claim and we are waiting on the inspector's follow-up.

We are vastly thankful for everyone's quick thinking and continued willingness to pitch in to work together in times of need to make the Creciente North Building Fire handled so well. Submitted by Gina Krause

Electrical Safety at Home



Tune up your electrical systems every 10 years

Prevent Fires by Looking for Electrical Hazards

- Zelectrical cords under rugs or behind furniture
 - Laptops and phones charging on beds or sofas
- Overloaded outlets



Practice Electrical Safety in Your Home

- Unplug appliances by pulling the plug, not the cord
- Remove items from overloaded outlets
- Use extension cords properly
- Use light bulbs of the correct wattage in lamps

Tune Up Electrical Systems Every 10 Years

The need to plug many things into a single outlet or the reliance on extension cords is a sign it's time to have an electrician review your system. Fire officials recommend having a licensed electrician review your home every 10 years. Small upgrades and simple safety checks, like making sure outdoor grounds and connections are secure, can prevent larger problems.

Electricians can:

Make sure circuit breakers are working properly

Place ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) receptacles near sinks, bathrooms, & outdoors to prevent electrocution

Install tamper-resistant receptacles (TRRs) that prevent young children from accessing outlets

Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years

Smoke alarms have a life span of about 10 years and should be replaced when they reach that age. Look for the date of manufacture to determine the age of your home's detectors.

Know the Warning Signs

Call your local fire department immediately if you notice warning signs like arcs, sparks, or short circuits. Other warning signs include hearing a sizzling or buzzing sound or smelling a vague odor of something burning. Firefighters can use thermal imaging technology to see excessive heat inside the walls. Immediate attention to these signs can save lives and prevent an electrical fire.

Call a professional electrician soon if you have other warning signs, including:

- Frequently blown fuses or tripped circuit breakers
 - Dim or flickering lights
 - Bulbs that wear out too fast
 - Overheated plugs, cords, or switches
- Shock or mild tingle more than normal static electricity when touching a switch or outlet
 - Loose outlets or unusually warm or faulty outlets or switches

Did You Know?

Do you know how we keep our JR Olympic sized pool temperature maintained? We have a Geothermal Heat Pump System which is also referred to as Ground Source Heat Pumps (GSHP's).

Ours is an Open Loop System. An open loop consists of 2 deep wells: one that supplies water to the heat pumps and one that returns water back to the ground.

Our 150 foot deep source well is located on the south end of Creciente and taps into an

aquifer with the discharge Well being approx. 50 feet down.


A system of pipes bring water to/from the pool heaters which use coils and freon to either extract heat (winter) or cool (summer) the water entering the pool. Then a computerized dispensing system or ORP Feeder balances acid/chlorine to keep the pool water clean and buffered.

We have six geo thermal units that are located in the fenced in area behind the pool house. They were replaced 13 years ago and are maintained by J & L Refrigeration.

When stormy weather, winds or sudden temperature swings dilute or cool the pool, our aging system can be a little challenged. It can take up to a few days for the water to be rebalanced. Your management team is aware and monitors the pool regularly.




So whether you are looking over the sparkling blue waters of our beautiful pool, enjoying a swim or just walking by, here is a brief glimpse into the mechanics of the GSHP's responsible for it.



We hope you enjoy our beautiful beaches during your stay. In addition to being a great place to enjoy the sun and surf, our beaches are important nesting areas for sea turtles and our dunes are home to many plants and animals. During your stay, we hope you will help us protect our coastal wildlife & habitats.

Sea turtle season is March 1 to October 31 (Atlantic coast) or May 1 to October 31 (Gulf coast), please remember a few simple things to help protect sea turtles & their habitats:

Avoid using flashlights, lanterns or flash photography while on the beach at night.



Turn off or shield lights, close drapes/blinds to prevent lights from shining onto the beach. Lights disturb nesting turtles and hatchlings.



Fill in holes and knock down sand castles to make the beach safe for sea turtles.



Make sure to remove all items, such as beach chairs and trash, from the beach at night.
