At Camp Horseshoe Troop 78 inducted several new members and as is a Troop 78 tradition, completed a substantial camp improvement project. The Troop removed the deteriorated section and then systematically, tediously replaced the floor under the direction of the tireless Ernie Heegard. Starting with a dirt floor, 5 to 6 inches of gravel was spread by using the old Ernie adage: many hands make light the work. Then the beams and joists were leveled and installed. We will return to install the tongue-and-groove. Troop 78 continues its long traditional of substantial camp improvement projects.
