When I was in the 5th grade, my best friend Mary and I discovered a solution to boredom: call boys on the phone. Luckily we both outgrew that self-soothing practice, just as we left behind the thumb sucking of infancy.

Even in adulthood, we all need self-soothing practices for when things are challenging in our lives – when we are anxious, worried or fearful. Self-soothing is a way of being nice to ourselves, nurturing ourselves, managing our emotions. Self-soothing practices help us enjoy life as we navigate stress, uncertainty and boredom.

Throughout our lives we all develop self-soothing practices, some that nurture us and are sustainable. Others - not so much.

Self-soothing that backfires

Some practices that serve us in the beginning eventually backfire or cause us harm. Think smoking, snacking, drinking alcohol, watching TV, spending. Some could be good, but we overdo them and end up feeling crabby as a result. Think gaming, a coloring app, social media, overwork.

Self-soothing worth cultivating

It is genuinely helpful to figure out what helps calm and nurture you and have several choices in your toolkit. The people who have fared best in this pandemic are those who have used tried and true self-soothing activities or cultivated some new ones. Real people I know have found the following helpful:

The Fishin' Hole



November is here and that means steelhead trout to everyone within reach of the Fishin' Hole. The weather at the end of October is certainly doing a perfect job to make sure there are tons of fish making their run up into the Erie tributaries. Steady rain and cool temperatures do mean one bad thing for potential anglers, huge crowds will be flocking up Interstate 79 right from the outset of November. Walnut creek will be elbow to elbow along with Elk creek. My advice is the same as it ever was, move, walk, explore and get away from the crowds. The rain means the fish are way up, the further you go the more likely you are

to have some breathing room. Don't forget to take every pre-caution to make sure you stay warm and dry. Nothing ruins a trip faster than the physical misery that comes from being cold and wet.

Closer to home but still a drive up Interstate 79, the perch are really biting in Lake Arthur. Fish the weed lines with minnows under a bobber or a suspending minnow lure. The jumbo-sized perch are both plentiful, and delicious. That's right! If you are willing to do the work of cleaning and cooking, fried fresh perch are as tasty as any fish in any four star restaurant. If you have an ultra-light rod and reel, catching them is incredibly fun as well. They are aggressive and run in very large schools. Once you land one you will continue to catch them until you grow weary. The bigger they are, the easier they are to clean and get a bone-free fillet. Once you have your fillets, all you need is some egg wash and some spicy panko bread crumbs. I was going to say, "you can thank me later" but as I am typing it and thinking about it, you should invite me over

for "perch bites and beers," that's really the best way to thank me!

Still closer to home, most of the approved trout waters in our area received a fall trout stocking at the tail end of October. Places that received all rainbow trout include Raccoon, Canonsburg and Dutch Fork lakes, and Pine Creek along with all the Deer Lakes. North Park lake is slated to get a stocking in the middle of December, but there are loads of fish in there already and the cooler temperatures on us now are really triggering the bite. Power baits will work for the stocked fish, but red worms are my favorite for fall trout. All the rules for staying warm and dry in Erie apply to fishing closer to home. The misery might be shorter if you only have a fifteen minute drive to get warm and dry but your fishing trip is

still ruined, if you get cold and wet. Fall fishing is a great way to spend some time on the water and away from the frustration that some of our local football teams provide from time to time. As I type this, Pitt is playing Miami, and I REALLY wish I was fishing. Keep those lines tight and send your pictures and stories to samdhall@comcast.net .


