**DRESS CODE**

We believe that students work best when they are neatly and appropriately groomed. Appropriate dress for school does not call attention to itself or disrupt classroom activities. Each student is expected to comply with the guidelines stated in the Crisp Academy Dress Code.

**General Dress Standards**

**Students should comply with all dress code standards during regular school hours, on field trips, and when attending or participating in any school function.**

- All attire must be appropriate for school.
- Attire which in any way draws undue attention or causes disruption in the learning environment is unacceptable.
- Faculty, staff, and administrators will determine acceptable/unacceptable attire and assign prescribed consequences for violations.

**Acceptable shirt styles**

- T-Shirts
- Collared shirts (includes turtleneck)
- Button-up shirts and blouses

**Shirt guidelines**

- Shirts should not have printed slogans, emblems, logos, advertising, or lettering that promotes alcohol, drugs, obscenities, or immoral suggestions.
- Sleeveless or cut out sleeves are not permitted.
- Low cut necklines are not permitted.
- Boys' shirts must be tucked in.
- Sheer blouses are not permitted, even over tank tops or camisoles.

**Acceptable pants/skirts/dresses**

- Jeans
- Dress Pants
- Khakis
- Shorts
- Skirts/Dresses

**Pant/Skirt/Dress/Shorts Guidelines**

- Pants or jeans with holes showing skin are not permitted
- Cut-off pants or cut-off jeans are not permitted.

### **Pant/Skirt/Dress/Shorts Guidelines (Cont'd)**

- All pants should be worn at the waistline.
- Dresses, Skirts and Shorts should be no more than approximately 3 inches above the knee.
- Skirts with side or front slits are not permitted.
- Sleeveless dresses are not permitted.
- Leggings may be worn under mid-thigh length shirts or dresses.
- Sweatpants, pajama pants, or exercise shorts are not permitted.

### **General Dress Code Rules**

- Outerwear (jackets, hoodies, sweaters, etc.) cannot be worn to conceal dress code violations.
- Exercise wear is not permitted. PE clothes should be worn in PE classes only.
- Appropriate undergarments should be worn and should not be visible at any time. Undershirts should be worn under other garments only.
- Shoes must be worn at all times. Flip-flops, slippers, or shower shoes are not permitted.
- Clothing that reveals cleavage or bare midriffs is not permitted.
- Hats and sunglasses are not permitted in the building except when prescribed for medical reasons.
- Extreme hairstyles or colors are not permitted.
- Extreme dress, make-up, or accessories are not permitted.
- Visible tattoos or body piercing is not permitted.
- Boys should not wear earrings.
- Boys' faces must be clean-shaven and hair should be well groomed and not below the ear.
- Hunting clothing or overalls are not permitted.
- On Fridays students may wear Crisp Academy Shirts
- Coaches will assign team apparel for athletes on game days.

### **Consequences for violations**

Teachers should monitor dress code during homeroom/announcements each morning and send all violations to the office at the end of homeroom. Dress code violations can be reported at any time during the school day and by any faculty member or administrator. The office will record violations and administer consequences.

- First Violation – Student will be referred to office and given a lab coat/slicker to wear the entire day.
- Second Violation – Student will be referred to the office, given a lab coat/slicker to wear the entire day, and be assigned one afternoon detention.
- Third Violation – Student will be referred to the office, given a lab coat/slicker to wear the entire day, and assigned ISS in the office for the day.
- Fourth and any Subsequent Violation – Student will be referred to the office and assigned OSS for the day.
