

Dear Parents / Guardians,
We kicked off our Catholic Schools Week on Sunday with an amazing Mass led by our students. The Pancake Breakfast/Faith Fair in the gymnasium was very well attended. Please refer to the Catholic Schools Week Itinerary that was sent home a couple of weeks ago or this newsletter to help keep track of all the rest of the activities going on this week.

If you have not sent in your RSVP for the Parent/Grandparent luncheon on Wednesday, January $31^{\text {st }}$ yet, please do so by TOMORROW: Tuesday, January $30^{\text {th }}$. This is very important so Mrs. Koenig knows how much food to prepare on this day. If you have children in both groups, we will have the older students attend lunch at that earlier time so you may all eat together.

This year's Catholic Schools Week theme is Learn, Serve, Lead, and Succeed. As for the service aspect, we will be doing a week long Dime War between the classes to raise money to be donated to several local charity organizations. Thank you so much for helping us to provide for those people in our community that our going through hard times.

If you are not familiar with how a "Dime War" works, here are some details. Students will be asked to bring in money to help their class win the Dime War. Each day the class with the highest point value will win a prize, with a Grand Prize of a Pizza Party and Non-Uniform Day going to the overall winning class. Dimes count for positive 10 points, so you want dimes in your class jar. All other money, counts as negative points, so you want to put those in other class jars to bring down their totals. For example: a quarter would count as negative 25 points, a dollar would be a negative 100 points, and so on.

We, as a school, will begin preparing ourselves for the Lenten Season. The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, on February 14th, and ends on Holy Thursday, March 29th. During these 40 days let us devote ourselves to the spiritual and corporal works of mercy that "remind us that faith finds expression in concrete everyday actions meant to help our neighbors in body and spirit." (USCCB) Help us, O Lord, to take inspiration for our Lenten journey through prayer, fasting, and giving alms.
