MOVING FORWARD

By the time you read this, a decision will have been made regarding the Capital campaign proposal for upgrading the church building. As I WRITE this, however, we are still more than a week away from that decision. And so, as I helped put together the newsletter, I was left to decide what I would write in this space. Would I GUESS at the outcome? That didn't seem like a good idea. Would I ignore the whole thing? Also, not a good idea. Instead, I will say this- whatever is to BE decided...now HAS been decided! And since that's the case, now what? What does a church do once a major decision is made- a decision that, by its very design, caused people to "choose sides"?

Here's what we do- we move forward. "So, you're assuming the proposal passed, is that it?" No, I'm not. As I've already said, I have NO idea what the proposal "did" as I write this prior to it doing ANYTHING. What I AM saying is this- we move forward- period. If the proposal passed, the hard work now begins! We roll up our sleeves and get at it. If, on the other hand, the proposal didn't pass...the hard work now begins! We roll up our sleeves and get at it!

Here's what I'm getting at- major decisions in the life of a church tend to create an atmosphere of division. People are not only invited but literally forced to "pick a side". I mean, there's a BALLOT involved, for goodness sake! And anytime human beings are asked to vote on something, the outcome caused some strife. It's natural. It's normal. But it doesn't have to be crippling. It doesn't have to "derail the train".

Things like elections cause more and more decisiveness in our country. Every 4 years, it feels like we as a nation draw further and further into two (or more) distinct "camps"- us against them. And that divide seems to A. never heal and B. grow wider and wider.

We have a GREAT opportunity right now to model a different behavior to the world. We are on the "other side" of a vote- a decision that has major impact on who we are as a group of believers moving forward. We can mirror society's knack for division...or we can refuse to give in to that mentality. There is a STRONG bond among those who call them themselves a part of The Aledo United Methodist Church. And our opportunity is to show Aledo, Mercer County and the world that we STILL have that strong bond- regardless of how any of us voted individually and regardless of the outcome.

However October 1 (the day of the vote) ended, the people have spoken. And I have to pray that God has spoken THROUGH the people. And so, we stick together and we move forward. Obviously, the outcome of that vote will dictate HOW we move forward. But it is God Who dictates THAT we move forward...and that we do it TOGETHER. God is good, all the time!


