

"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were." Acts 2:1-2

The feast of Pentecost is celebrated 50 days after the Resurrection of Jesus. It is often referred to as the birthday of the Church because Pentecost is when the apostles went out among the people and began spreading Jesus' message, thus establishing the beginning of the Church.

With the help of the Holy Spirit, the Church was able to fulfill Jesus' teachings and sanctify its members through the Sacraments Jesus instituted, in other words, we grow in holiness through receiving the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist.

No one has seen the Holy Spirit, even the Apostles. The three symbols of the Holy Spirit are fire, wind and the dove. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red.




