Thank you God

Luke 16: 19-21 *“There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and lived in luxury every day. At his gate was laid a beggar named Lazarus, covered with sores and longing to eat what fell from the rich man’s table. Even the dogs came and licked his sores.”*

Patty and I have been so blessed to come to Chambersburg. We have a new roof over our head, food on our table, a loving church family, cars, and I could go on and on. Thank you God for all these blessings. Often for thanksgiving families start with telling something they are thankful for. Thanks God for my family. Thanks God for the food we are about to eat. Thanks God for giving me such a good place to live. Maybe this year one of the prayers might be, *“Thank you God for the opportunities you give me to serve those in need and the strength and courage to do it.”*

In this story of Lazarus and the rich man almost everyone reading this article is living the life of the rich man/women. Some of you now may be saying, “I’m not rich.” If you don’t think you’re the rich man/women ask yourself two questions: First-How would you respond if someone approached you covered in sores from head to toe, dirty, smelly, and probably very scary looking? Next- When was the last time you longed to eat what fell from another’s table? Have you ever sat in a restaurant and saw someone spill some food on the floor and you wanted run over and yell, *“five second rule”* so you could eat what had fallen? Welcome to the world of the rich man/women. Now let’s turn it around and ask: When is the last time you shared the scrapes from your table with those in need in the community. I do mean the poor, the lonely, the lost, and not your equally rich neighbor.

In this passage it is clear that there is only one time to do what is right: the present. After all, the rich man drops dead at the same time as Lazarus, even though he is safely sheltered, well fed

and free of sores. We shouldn't put off until tomorrow what we can accomplish today, because we can never predict for whom the bell will toll for tomorrow. Jesus message wasn't particularly novel. Moses warned: *"do not be hard-hearted or tight-fisted toward your needy neighbor: (Deuteronomy 15:7) and Isaiah 58 says, "Is it not to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house?"* The word of God is clear to all God's people. We're called to turn away from selfishness and greed, and turn toward our neighbors in need.

I don't expect you will have a man with sores approach you this Thanksgiving season, but maybe the next time you're sitting in your favorite restaurant and you see that young family with the three little ones you can ask your waitress to add their bill to yours. Ask no credit for what you do but for the glory of God. Maybe the next time you are at the grocery store you buy a gift card and leave it with the clerk to give to someone who looks like they need it. Again,

for the Glory of God. Maybe every time you go out to eat you commit to giving two dollars to the Blessing Box. There are so many possibilities to say, Thank you God! Jesus couldn't be clearer, *"I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me. Just as you did to the least of my brothers and sisters, says Jesus, you did it to me."* Mathew 25

God bless you all and I pray each and every one of you has a Happy Thanksgiving. Laugh with your family and friends, eat a bit too much turkey, and watch that football game, but remember, 'Thank God for the opportunities you are given to serve,' and go forth and live out your faith. Amen,

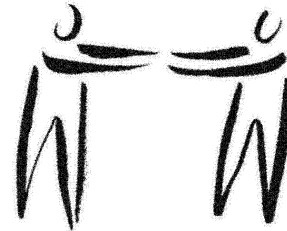

Sunday School—Sherri Arrowood

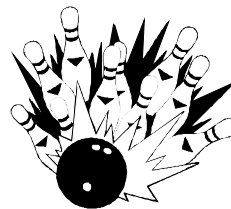
