Two Harbors Dedicates Campground Addition to Representative David Dill

On Monday, August 14 a crowd gathered to commemorate the dedication of the "Representative David Dill Addition" of the Burlington Bay Municipal Campground.

The former House Representative David Dill died of cancer at the age of 60 on August 8, 2015. A resident of Crane Lake, Minnesota, and member of the Minnesota Democratic-Farmer-Labor (DFL) political party, Dill was elected for seven terms in the House.

A Minnesota state Representative, Dill represented District 3A which encompasses Cook and Koochiching counties, along with portions of Lake and St. Louis counties. His tenure at the House of Representatives ran from 2002 until 2015, with an unfinished term that would have ended in 2016.

Dill was often credited by city officials as being instrumental in securing the bonding funds necessary for the \$1.5 million expansion of the city-owned and run RV campground at Burlington Bay. Even though redistricting in 2012 changed the boundaries that defined Dill's district and put the city of Two Harbors in Representative Mary Murphy's district, the city is

acknowledging his ongoing assistance throughout his lifetime.

In attendance at the dedication were Representative Mary Murphy, Two Harbors Mayor Chris Swanson and members of the city council, and Dill's wife, Tucky.

The campground addition was designed in a raised-tier layout for better views of Lake Superior, and to accommodate 31 larger campers and RVs, as well as a commons building housing an office and showers.

Funding assistance for infrastructure development of the campground expansion and commons building was provided through the Iron Range Resources & Rehabilitation Board.

A very popular campground, the city of Two Harbors reports a great success rate of reservations and visitors, with nearly all of the 137 sites completely booked during the busy tourist season from May to October. Currently reporting about \$200,000 in annual revenue, the campground is hoping to generate significant revenue for the city's general fund.

NASA TV to Broadcast Solar Eclipse

GRAND RAPIDS, MN – August 15, 2017 – Mediacom subscribers can watch complete live coverage of the 2017 Solar Eclipse on August 21 and see the unique, close-up views NASA will capture with scientific cameras placed along the path of totality. NASA's live broadcast coverage of the solar eclipse will be televised on Mediacom's local channel 22 (HD channels 822 or 722) starting at 9:00 am CST, and will continue until 3:00 pm CST.

The NASA -produced coverage will begin with a pre-show hosted at NASA TV's home base at the College of Charleston in South Carolina. The main program, beginning at 12:00 noon central time, will track the path of totality where the moon fully covers the sun for a few short minutes. The first point of contact begins at Lincoln Beach, Oregon at 9:05 am PDT, with the total eclipse in that location

"Each experience, starting with adaptive yoga that met my husband where he was at with his very limited mobility early on after two strokes, through bicycling and sailing, have been amazing experiences of acceptance, fun, and hope. That hope has not just touched us, but our whole family, who can hear in his voice the renewed confidence and excitement at new adventures, freedom, independence, and strengthening connections to our greater human family at Courage Kenny who have done so much, shared so much."
