Campaign Office to Open in September

To facilitate our ability to work for our candidates we have leased office space that will be used to open a District 23 campaign office. The office is located at: 8520 E. Shea Blvd., Scottsdale, AZ 85260.

The location is just west of the Shea Blvd. and Loop 101 interchange, so the location is very central and convenient.

Our office suite is in the North Building with the main entrance on the south side of the building. The office is fully furnished and we are currently working on getting phones and Internet service installed.

What We Envision for the Campaign Office

Once the office is open, we plan to have campaign materials available for all of our candidates. We also will make the facility available for use by any of our candidates that need a location for meetings or phone calls. Once the phones are installed, we want to organize phone banks and start doing outbound calling for our candidates. We also want to have all kinds of campaign literature, yard signs and other materials available for anyone who wants them.

What We Need

The biggest thing we need outside of the phones and Internet will be computing resources. If you have unused computers that are in working condition that we can borrow, please let one of the board members know. If you can bring your own laptop when you volunteer, that would be great as well.

We Need Volunteers

We need volunteers to man the office so it can be open as much as possible. Ideally, we'd like to see the office open from 12:00pm to 6:00pm at a minimum. We would also like to do phone calls in the evening on a scheduled basis.

We will be discussing many of the details at the Board meeting on September 5th and should have much more information at the District meeting on September 13th.

On to Victory in November

We have a ton of work to do to get our candidates elected. If you can't support the office with your time by volunteering, we could really use your financial support. While we got a great deal on the office space, it is still a large chunk of money. We would really love to see all of our PCs make some small contribution if possible.

FIRST VICE CHAIRMAN - JOE ROMACK

The Primary elections have finally concluded, and it sure seems like the campaigns lasted forever! First I would like to congratulate David Schweikert on his imminent re-election to Congress. He ran a well organized and well planned campaign and I am thankful that he is returning for a second term. We need a lot more David Schweikerts in Congress.

Second, congratulations are due to our newly re-elected State Representatives John Kavanagh and Michelle Ugenti, who both ran honorable, dignified campaigns. Our state Legislature sure needs their Conservative presence.

And, finally, we have just concluded the primary that will result in the election of precinct committeemen for each precinct. Until the results of the election are certified, we do not know who has been elected, especially in the precincts where there was an over quota.

Typically, the election results are not certified until about 2 weeks after the election. Once the results are certified and we have our list of elected PCs, I will contact all of the PCs in each precinct and set up a meeting and hold elections for Captains. Once all of the Captain elections are concluded, I will distribute a district wide list of those results.

In addition, I will hold training for both new PCs and any current PCs at the end of September, in order to prepare us for our work ahead. We can also start the process of identifying and appointing additional PCs. Please feel free to contact me if you need a nominating form, or have any questions about the process.

Last week, I attended the premier of the **2016** movie, which is a narrative on what we as a nation could expect if Obama wins a second term. The story that was told was shocking to say the least. It certainly strengthened my resolve to make sure that we get the Romney-Ryan ticket elected. In the next few months, there will be plenty of opportunities for Precinct Committeemen to get involved and make it happen! Stay tuned.
