Chief Choate mentioned that there are several sites they are looking at but we can't do anything until the grant is awarded. Thompson mentioned that we are looking at a centralize location and modernizing it. Lawane Chin asked if there were two stations in Immokalee. Tommy Guscinski asked if this project combined with EMS to provide a central station both and are they in negotiations. Chief Choate said yes and went into details about it. It sounds ludicrous to get a station out here in less than 4 years. Commissioner Goodnight discussed went into details about the station. Brister mentioned that it's efficient of how we are doing it. Ralph Petragnani asked as residents of Ave Maria; is there anything they can do. Commissioner Goodnight mentioned yes. The more people that speak to the county commissioners about it; the more impact it will make. This is our number one priority. Chief Choate also mentioned that it is our number one priority for building Station 32. Tommy Guscinski mentioned that there should be more cooperation among the groups that are trying to get something done. We are putting a lot of money into Impact Fees and the county. Commissioner Goodnight mentioned that we have an open door policy so, if anyone ever needs anything. We would like to hear it.

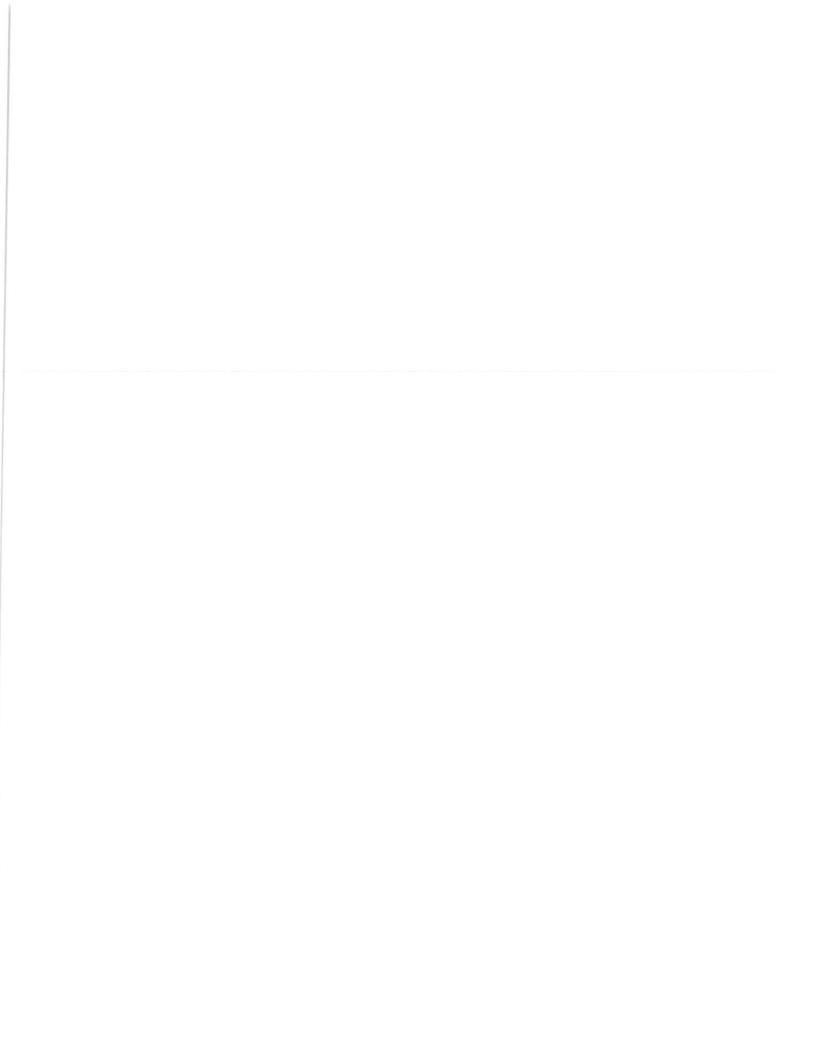
### C. Old Business

Commissioner Goodnight mentioned that she will ask Alma to notify them ahead of time. FF/EMT Bryant Bruzos and FF/EMT Derek Tubriano are present and he presented the certificates.

### 12) Concerns of Commissioners

Commissioner Halman asked Chief Choate if he could discuss the PIO situation. Chief Choate mentioned that he met with Battalion Chief Cunningham regarding this. Some information was put out prematurely and they will have a cooperative effort between fire rescue, highway patrol, sheriffs' office, EMS to come together with information.

13) Public Comment; Limited to 3 minutes per person

Tommy asked about the merger of the Unions. Are the districts coming together and is Big Island Corkscrew involved. Commissioner Goodnight mentioned that there are a lot of things that we need to get in order in-house before we think of other things. We are looking at doing some interlocal agreements for the future and save money. In the future, we may see if not a complete consolidation; consolidated a lot of the things we need help with. Inspections have now been turned over to North Collier. A real consolidation of one board. The biggest problem is that 50% of the people in Immokalee pays no Ad Valorem taxes. Tommy mentioned that in regard to

Seminole Tribe; we talked about a cost factor of rolling out an engine crew. Is our cost higher or lower than North Naples costs? Chief Choate mentioned that our costs are significantly lower than North Collier. It boils down to the fire fighters salaries. His overall plan is to make us as efficient as we can and if that means signing more and more agreements with North Collier to find more relief; We will absolutely do it. They are so deep in resources and personnel that; I would be negligent if I didn't take advantage of it. It makes economic sense and responses and crews on the ground. We are working hand in hand with them. Commissioner Goodnight mentioned that she was impressed with what the commissioners had to say and do for this district. That is what we need. Battalion Chief Cunningham mentioned that Ave Maria University and other structures don't pay Ad Valorem taxes.

### Chief Choate:

As requested, I have spent 2 full days reviewing the existing and past FEMA funded grants that have been awarded to Immokalee Fire Control District, since 2011. Presently there are 4 grants that remain in an active status, which I will provide a brief report on my findings to date.

Please understand that a more indepth review of the 2013 and 2014 SAFER grants will be necessary due to the discrepancies noted below. I will continue to work with you on these grants in the future, if so desired.

### 2013 SAFER Grant (0593) Recruitment and Retention - Volunteer Coordinator Position and support

Award amount: \$457, 942.00 – Federal Funds

Period of Performance: 08/07/2014 to 08/06/2018

Basic Scope of Award: Salary and Benefits for Volunteer Coordinator position (currently filled by Captain Devan); NFPA 1582 Physicals for new volunteers, Firefighter I and Firefighter II (up to 40 in year one and 10 each in years 2-4); Tuition assistance/professional certification \$7500/year for approved courses, and PPE (wildland and structural) for the new Coordinator. A more detailed description of the scope of the award can be found in the original application.

Present Status: Active, needs further review.

- 1) The spreadsheets found in the paper files for reimbursement requests, do not match the files in the computer.
- 2) The computer generated files were all modified on or about March 13, 2017, with the exception of 1 there is no explanation that has been found as of yet, for these changes.
- 3) Modifications to the original scope of the award (purchase PPE for new recruits in lieu of tuition assistance) was discussed via telephone and email (as evidenced by emails) but no formal amendment was submitted by the District or approved by FEMA.

### Actions Needed:

- 1) Confirm all salary expenses to ensure costs are in compliance and determine which set of records should be utilized review payroll details in comparison to available spreadsheets.
- 2) Confirm that all non-salary costs are accounted for with invoices, payment, who costs were incurred for, etc.
- 3) Confirm that all current activities and numbers of personnel are in compliance with original scope of the award.

### 2013 AFG Grant (1003) - Portable and Mobile P25 Compliant Radios

Award amount: \$121,722.00 Total Award Amount

\$12,172.00 - District Share

\$109,550.00 - Federal Share

Period of Performance: 06/04/2014 to 06/03/2015

Basic Scope of Award: To secure purchase of portable and mobile P25 compliant radios in order to meet FCC compliance. Specific details can be found in the grant application.

Present Status: Undetermined, needs immediate action.

- 1) A closeout module notification was email to Chief Anderson on or about 9/9/2016 indicating that any grant whose period of performance ended prior to 08/12/2016 would have 90 days from 08/12/2016 to file all close out documents and reports. (close out deadline approximated to be 11/10/2016).
- 2) On March 30, 2017, an email was sent to Chief Anderson indicating "Closeout Action Required" and identified "contemplated actions" that could be taken by FEMA and result in deobligation of funding, if no reply or notice of intent was received within 30 days.
- 3) Chief Anderson provided closeout information on or about April 3, 2017, but the District has not received any notice that this information was received by FEMA.

### Action Needed:

- 1) Obtain confirmation that the grant was closed out in accordance with March 30, 2017 notice.
- 2) Obtain authorization for an extension and submit closeout materials ASAP, if necessary.

### 2014 SAFER GRANT (0126) - Hiring/Retaining Firefighting Personnel

Award Amount: \$2,012,052.00 - Federal Funds

Period of Performance: 11/09/2015 to 11/08/2017

Basic Scope of Award: To retain 6 personnel already funded by a previous SAFER grant, and to hire 9 additional personnel, to increase ability to meet NFPA 1720 standards. Specific details can be found in the grant application.

Present Status: Active, needs urgent action.

- 1) Reimbursement Request #4 has been declined by FEMA due to discrepancies in personnel. The request has been released for an update by the District.
- 2) SF425 Financial Report forms are not in balance with allocated funds as per FEMA and reimbursement requests.
- 3) 4th quarter, quarterly report was overdue, and duly noted by grant reviewer.

### Action Needed:

- 1) First item of action is to review actual payroll reports and records against reimbursement requests, which will allow the District to amend the SF425 report. This information, as indicated by FEMA, needs to begin at the time the grant began 11/09/2015 to present.
- Request an extension to the timeline to submit the update to Reimbursement Request #4, and complete the personnel update, as well as any changes that may be necessary as a result of the verification of SF425 Financial reports.

### 2015 AFG Grant (06716) - SCBA Equipment

Award Amount: \$252,008 - Total Award

\$22,909.00 – District Share

\$229,099.00 - Federal Share

Basic Scope of Award: Purchase SCBA equipment and accessories as described within the grant application. Specific details can be found in the grant application.

Present Status: Active, needs amended

1) The reimbursement request for this grant was denied as there were items purchased that were not approved in the scope of the award.

### Action Needed:

- 1) Review purchases made, revise current request for reimbursement to reflect only those items provided in scope of the award.
- 2) File and amendment to utilize and remaining funds to allow for the purchase of items that were not included in the original scope of the grant.
- 3) Submit a second reimbursement request, if amendment approved, to obtain reimbursement for the items already purchased, that were not within the original scope of the grant.

In addition, please be aware that the amount of funding received by the District in FY15-16 exceeds \$750,000 and therefore requires an independent audit of the grant funding. This is over and above the Districts audit.

This is an initial report. There are still many hours of work to be done to ensure that all grant funding remains intact and does not threaten the Districts ability to obtain additional funding in the future.

: Development and Implementation of a Special Assessment Program to Fund Fire Protection Services and Facilities

#### Chief Anderson:

I am pleased to submit this proposal on behalf of Bryant Miller Olive ("BMO") and Burton & Associates ("Burton") for assisting the Immokalee Fire Control District (the "District") with the development and implementation of a special assessment program to fund fire protection services. Our experience in this area is extensive and includes call-based and availability methodologies for apportioning fire assessments. BMO and Burton have collaborated in assisting communities throughout the State of Florida with assessment matters including Avon Park, Stuart, Largo, Daytona Beach, St. Cloud, Fort Myers, Orange City and Casselberry. The firms assisted Cape Coral with development of its fire assessment and successfully defended that program both at trial and before the Florida Supreme Court in a landmark decision which confirmed home rule authority for the imposition of assessments and upheld the availability method of cost allocation (Morris v. City of Cape Coral, 163 So.3d 1174 (Fla. 2015). We are highly qualified for the engagement and stand ready to provide the services contemplated by the District in a timely and efficient manner.

The scope of services involved with development and implementation of a fire assessment program generally includes the following:

 Acquire and analyze relevant data and documentation including master parcel list, millage coding documentation, budgetary information and interlocal or service delivery agreements.

- 2. Develop a non-ad valorem assessment roll including all tax parcels proposed for assessment.
- 3. Collaborate with District staff to develop a critical events schedule including key dates for necessary actions and deliverables.
- 4. Prepare and present to the Board of Fire Commissioners an assessment report describing apportionment methodologies available for cost allocation and providing exemplary funding scenarios and assessment rates based upon such methodologies.
- 5. Prepare resolution(s) and other documents authorizing and initiating the process required for imposition and collection of the assessments pursuant to the tax bill collection method authorized by section 197.3632, Florida Statutes.
- 6. Draft and provide notices for publication and mailing, facilitate provision of notice with District staff.
- 7. Assist with the process for conducting any referendum necessary for imposition of the assessments.
- 8. Draft and provide reimbursement agreements between the District and the Collier County Tax Collector and Collier County Property Appraiser, respectively, as required by section 197.3632(2), Florida Statutes.
- 9. Appear before and assist the Commission with a required public hearing to impose the assessments.

BMO and Burton will provide such services at our customary rates for fire assessment engagements which are \$295 per hour for BMO and \$275 per hour for Burton. The firms estimate that total professional fees for the engagement will not exceed \$30,000 plus a contingency amount of \$5,000. The firms will not exceed such total without prior written authorization of the District. The fee estimate set forth above does not include expenses associated with any required notice mailings, publications or referendum expenses, or billing of the assessments which will be the responsibility of the District. Accomplishing the District's objectives may not require the entire budget appropriation; however, the direction of the District will control the work effort and other matters of influence beyond the direct control of the District and/or the firms may impact the anticipated work effort, and additional budget appropriations may be required.

We will bill periodically but not less often than monthly, by a single detailed invoice submitted by BMO on behalf of both firms reflecting hours and expenses with all appropriate back-up materials typically required by governmental entities, unless directed otherwise. In addition to hourly rates, the firms will invoice for reimbursement for actual costs incurred, such as computer printing or photocopies, long distance telephone charges, travel expenses, and overnight delivery charges. Any travel expenses will be reimbursed in accordance with Section 112.061, Florida Statutes. Fees and expenses incurred in developing, implementing and maintaining a special assessment program may be recovered by the District through proceeds of the assessment

Attorney-Client Relationship and Conflicts. During the engagement, BMO will represent the District as special counsel and an attorney-client relationship will exist between BMO and the District. We understand that Ken Thompson, Esq., acts as general counsel to the District and we will keep Mr. Thompson apprised as to the status of the work effort and collaborate with him throughout the engagement in furtherance of achieving District goals.

The rules regulating The Florida Bar provide that a conflict of interest exists whenever a lawyer represents one client in a matter adverse to another client. The lawyer may proceed with the representation of one client if, after disclosure of the conflict, both clients consent to the representation. We have disclosed to the District that we have, currently do and may in the future, serve as special counsel, bond, disclosure or other counsel to other local governments or otherwise act as counsel to underwriters, investment banks and commercial banks on public finance matters. From time to time, we may represent the firms which may underwrite or purchase bonds, notes or other obligations issued by the District and other financial institutions hired by the District in connection with projects and financings for other governmental entities on unrelated matters. In either case, such representations are standard and customary within the public finance and municipal bond industry. In our opinion, we can effectively represent the District and discharge BMOs professional responsibilities notwithstanding our representation of other parties in unrelated matters, either because such representations will be sufficiently different or because the potential for such conflict is remote and minor and outweighed by consideration that it is unlikely that advice given to the other client will be relevant in any respect to the subject matter, and the District expressly consents to such other representations consistent with the circumstances herein described. However, BMO will inform the District as to any potential engagements which may implicate multiparty representation concerns and the District reserves the right to identify a representation that it finds objectionable, in which case BMO agrees to take appropriate steps to resolve the issue as required by the rules of The Florida Bar.

The District may cancel or terminate the engagement at any time upon written notice. In the event of termination, the firms will immediately cease work and shall be reimbursed for eligible and documented time at the hourly rates set forth above prior to the notice to stop work.

### Requested funds for Previous Chief Paul Anderson.

#### SEVERANCE AGREEMENT AND GENERAL RELEASE

This Severance Agreement and General Release ("Agreement") is hereby made and entered into by and between PAUL ANDERSON, JR. ("Employee") and the IMMOKALEE FIRE CONTROL DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as "Employer"). In exchange for the mutual promises set forth below and intending to be legally bound, the Employer and the Employee agree to the following terms and conditions:

- A. Employee was employed as the Fire Chief for said Employer; and
- B. Employee was terminated from employment without cause in accordance with his Employment Agreement effective April 5, 2017. As such, April 5, 2017 shall be Employee's final day of employment and the Employer shall have no obligation to employ Employee under any circumstances in the future and Employee waives any alleged right or entitlement to future employment and agrees any future application for employment shall not be considered.
- C. In accordance with the Employment Agreement, if employee accepts the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Employee shall receive the gross amount of \$45,384.62, less applicable withholdings and other required deductions, as the Severance Amount, in addition to continued coverage of medical, dental, vision and life insurance for twenty (20) weeks, through and including August 22, 2017. The payment of such Severance Amount is more fully set forth in Paragraph G.
- D. It is agreed and understood that neither the offer or acceptance of this Agreement nor the payment of any money or provision of benefits hereunder constitute or will be construed as an admission of liability or of any wrongdoing or violation of laws, rules or policies by the Employer or the Employee.
- E. Employee hereby releases and discharges the Employer (and all of its affiliates, successors, assigns, directors, officers, insurers, elected officials, employees, attorneys, and agents) from and against any and all liability to Employee upon claims, causes of action or obligations of every nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, arising out of or relating to Employee's employment, separation from employment, or any other act, event, failure to act or things which have occurred or were created at any time before or upon the date on which this Agreement becomes effective. Without limiting the generality hereof, this release covers claims or causes of action based upon all torts (such as, for example, negligence, fraud, defamation, wrongful discharge, invasion of privacy); express and implied contracts (except this Agreement); federal, state or local statutes and ordinances, including those which regulate employment practices (such as, for example, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, Family Medical Leave Act, Federal Civil Rights Acts (including but not limited to 42 U.S.C.A Sections 1981 - 1988, 2000a-6, and 2000e-17); the Americans with Disabilities Act: the Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act: the National Labor Relations Act; the Older Worker Benefit Protection Act; The Florida Civil Rights Act; any state or federal Whistleblower's Act; Public Employee Relations Act; Title VII of the Civil Rights Act; the Civil Rights Act of 1991; the Reconstruction Era Civil Rights Act of 1866; the Employee Retirement Income Security Act; the Public Health Services Act; Sarbanes-Oxley; the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act; the Equal Pay Act; Florida Statute Section 112.82; the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act; the Occupational Safety and Health Act; the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act; the Florida Civil Rights Act; the Florida Equal Pay Act; the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; any claims under Fla. Stat. 448.08 for unpaid wages and waivable rights under the Florida Constitution; and any and all amendments to such acts); any and all claims for violation of any statutory or administrative rules, regulations or codes; any right or entitlement to any individual relief including damages, attorney's fees, and costs which may be available through local, state, or federal regulatory agencies such as the EEOC or FCHR; expenses, costs, fees, and/or attorneys' fees, incurred or claimed in connection with any alleged claims; and every other source of legal rights and obligations which may validly be waived or released, except rights created or preserved expressly in this Agreement.
- F. The Employee makes the following representations to the Employer, each of which is necessary before the Employer will make payment of the Severance Pay to the Employee under this Agreement:

- (1) that the payments and other benefits which the Employer has agreed to provide, as stated herein, are payments and benefits to which he would not be entitled if it were not for this Agreement;
- (2) that no consideration, promises, agreements or representations have been made to encourage him to sign this Agreement, except those that are contained in this Agreement;
- (3) that he has read and understands each and every provision of this Agreement and any waiver pursuant to this Agreement is knowing and voluntary;
- (4) that he has been advised by the Employer that he has seven (7) days from the date he signs this Agreement to revoke his acceptance of this Agreement in writing by delivering such written revocation to the District's Attorney within the 7-day period;
- (5) that he has been advised by the Employer that he should consult an attorney of his own choosing before signing this Agreement;
- (6) that he has had an adequate and reasonable period of time (up to twenty-one (21) days) to decide whether or not to sign this Release. Accordingly, failure to sign and return the Agreement to the District's Attorney on or before 5:00 p.m. on April 27, 2017, shall be deemed a rejection of the Agreement and he shall not be entitled to the benefits outlined herein to which he would not otherwise be entitled. Material or immaterial changes to this Agreement do not restart the running of the 21-day period. Employee may waive his right to consider the Agreement for the full length of the above-referenced time period and may voluntarily elect to execute and deliver the Agreement at any time prior to April 27, 2017.
- (7) that he has not filed any complaints or initiated any other legal proceedings against the Employer before the date of signing this Agreement.
- (8) that he has not assigned, transferred or purported to assign or transfer any claims released in this Agreement to any person, association or entity.
- (9) that he has accurately reported all hours worked and has been paid in full for all time worked in accordance with the law and is owed no wages, whether in the form of straight time, overtime, or liquidated damages.
- (10) that he has not suffered an occupational disease or disability or any on-the-job-related accident or injury of the type that might have entitled him to file a Workers' Compensation claim, whether temporary, permanent, partial or total.
- (11) that he was provided and received all paid and unpaid leaves of absence to which he was entitled.
- (12) that he assumes the risk for any mistake of fact now known or unknown and that he understands the significance of this Agreement.
- (13) that he has the mental capacity to enter into this Agreement.
- (14) that he has returned all Employer-issued property in his possession.
- (15) that he has submitted any and all expense reports or other expenditures believed to be reimbursable by Employer, including required receipts or other backup, prior to executing this Agreement.
- (16) that he is not aware of any liens and/or pending legal claims applicable to the Severance Amount and agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Employer, its elected officials, agents, insurers, attorneys or representatives, against any lien, claim or action asserted against the Severance Amount and that he will be solely responsible to satisfy any liens or pending legal claims asserted against the Employee, or

Employer, its elected officials, agents, insurers, attorneys, or representatives, as against the Severance Amount.

G. In exchange for the Severance Agreement and General Release and other promises and acknowledgments made by Employee in this Agreement, the Employer agrees to make payment to Employee the Severance Amount equal to \$45,384.62, which is equivalent to twenty (20) weeks of compensation plus twenty (20) weeks of medical insurance at the current amount payable under the Fire Chief Employment Contract. Employee shall also be entitled to continue on the District's dental, vision and life insurance at the District's current level of expense for a period of twenty (20) weeks. Such payment shall be subject to applicable withholdings and required deductions. Such Severance Amount shall be made payable to Paul Anderson Jr. within ten (10) days after the expiration of the revocation period set forth in Paragraph F(4). Such payment shall be delivered to Paul Anderson Jr., P.O. Box 344, Immokalee, FL 34143.

In accordance with the Employment Agreement, Employee shall be paid all accrued and unused vacation and sick leave at the time of termination, which shall be payable on the next regular District payroll date after the date of termination.

- H. Employee and Employer agree (unless otherwise required by law) not to:
  - (1) disclose to any third party any confidential information of the other party; or
  - (2) file any claims waived by this Agreement.
- In any action brought for breach of this Agreement or to enforce the terms of this Agreement, the prevailing party in any such action shall be entitled to recover all costs and attorney's fees incurred in moving to enforce it or for breach of it from the non-prevailing party.
- J. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Employer and Employee and each of their successors, assigns, affiliates, devisees, heirs, administrators and representatives.
- K. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement by and among the parties hereto and there are no agreements or commitments by or among the parties, either verbal or written, except as expressly set forth herein.
- L. Should any part, term, or provision of this Agreement be declared or be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the legality, validity and enforceability of the remaining parts, terms, or provisions shall not be affected thereby, and said illegal, unenforceable or invalid part, term, or provision shall be deemed not a part of this Agreement.
- M. The Agreement shall be governed exclusively by Florida Law and venue for any action herein shall be in the courts of Collier County.
- N. The parties agree that this Agreement shall be construed as jointly prepared by the parties so that any uncertainty or ambiguity shall not be interpreted against any one party and in favor of the other.
- O. The rights, responsibilities, and duties of the parties, and the agreements herein, shall continue to bind the parties in full force and effect until each and every obligation has been fully performed.
- P. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and will become effective and binding upon the parties as of the effective date at such time as all the signatories hereto have signed a counterpart of this Agreement, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same Agreement. In the event an executed version of this Agreement is transmitted by facsimile or is scanned and emailed, the Agreement shall be effective and binding as if it were the originally executed document. However, Employee will deliver original documents to the District's Attorney as soon as possible.

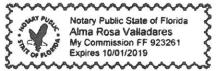

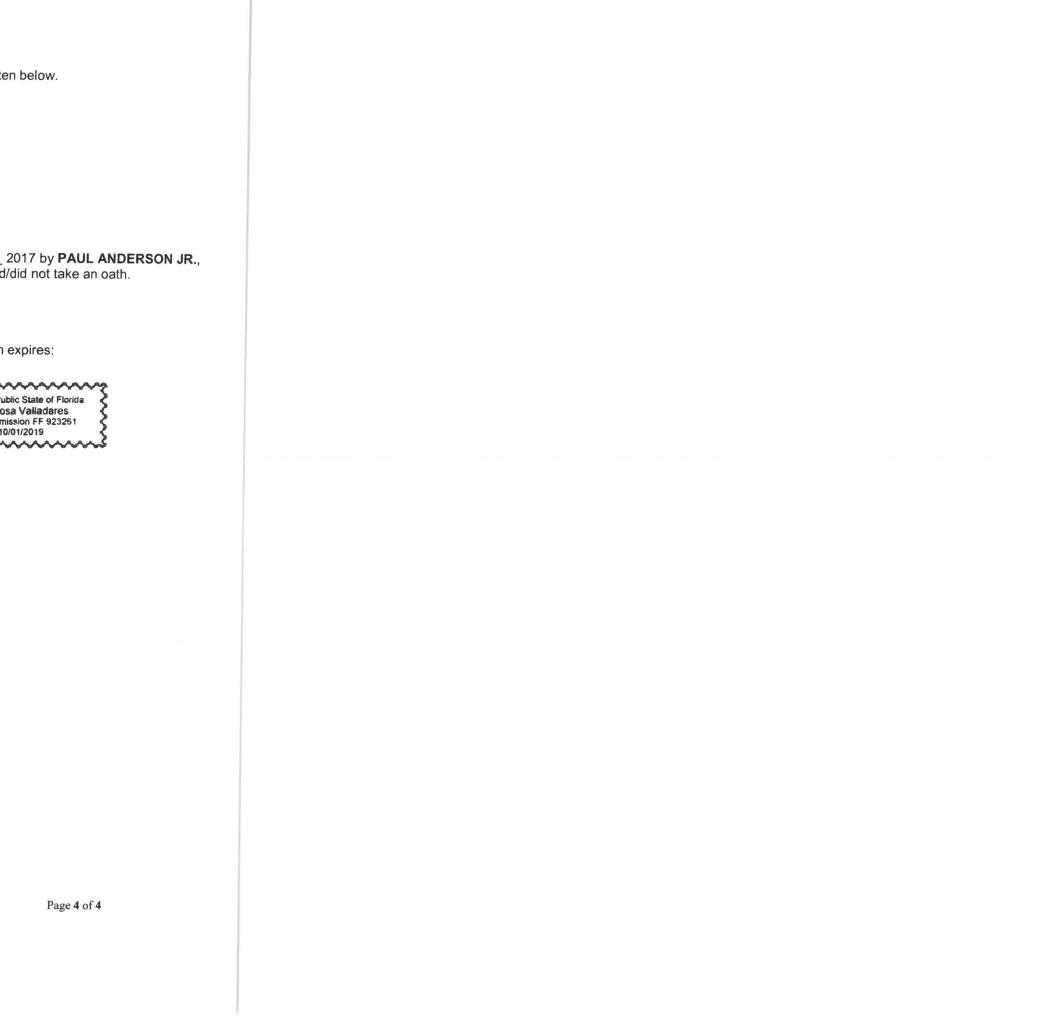
