A variety of colorful butter dishes including Royal Winton (one dating back to 1924), a copper dish, a stick style dish that was hand painted to match Royal Jackson "Autumn" china, a child's butter dish by Westmoreland in white, a black Mosser Glass tub butter dish, and Carol's favorite - Heisey Etched Rose.

The depression glass butter dishes included Sharon, Daisy & Button, Princess, Swirl, Colonial Block, Flora Gold (stick), Waterford Waffle, Fostoria American, Baltimore Pear, Zipper/Pinwheel, Wexford (stick), Cambridge with silver lid, and Indian Glass Co. recollection Madrid issued in 1976 in honor of the bicentinial (from Donna Terrio).
