Chimney work began this week! Donavon Merriman and his team have started work to stabilize and cover the chimney as approved by our congregation. His initial inspection reported a small number of bricks in need of repair, along with discoloration on 5-6 feet of the chimney. Based on his experience, he estimates that the discoloration can lead to water damage within 3-5 years. This would require significantly higher repair costs. He also discovered the cap was cracked in multiple places Weather permitting, work will continue on the stucco chimney covering.

Hello St. Mark's Lutheran,

Here we are deep into September. Football has begun in earnest. Jackets and scarves that had been stashed away are coming out again.
