Auxiliary members have been living and practically breathing this statement for almost 100 years. Prior to the inception of the American Legion Auxiliary 1919' women have been supporting their country when and where they were needed. And they weren't just in the factories either. Women volunteered during the American Revolution as spies. During the Civil War women began serving as scouts, encryption specialists, agent handlers, and spies. World War 1, 30,000 American women, served in the Army, the Navy, the Marine Corps, and Coast Guard. Their duties included translators, telephone operators, drivers, and cryptologists overseas and on the home front. World War 11, 4,500 women played major roles in OSS missions, from clerical to operational.

We are still facing many conflicts here which need our support. Preserving the dignity of our Veterans as they age or have become impaired is important to their well-being. This year Department President's Special Project is "Paws in Service" <u>Soldiers Best Friend</u>, for our Veterans and their Families. Have you contacted the schools in your area about doing something for the First Responders (police and firemen) in your community? Have you contacted anyone about the "Paws in Service" President's Project?

Do you hold or participate in a memorial service for 9-11 or POW? Both are educational as it has been 15 years since the 2001 terrorist attack and most of the kids you would be educating were not even born yet. Same with the POW memorial service. Think of all the kids you could educate about what this means! With a few telephone calls and a little bit of coordination with the school administration, you can take these educational services into the schools. Don't have the service put together? Just contact me and I can send one to you. All of the above pertain to Education and other programs.

September is a great time to start working on the "give 10 to Education" program which can include giving "10" items to assist with education of students. The following are some suggestions:

- 1. Donate \$10 towards Scholarships, national or local.
- 2. Donate 10 pair of socks, shoes or items of clothing to a pre-school or kindergarten class.
- 3. Donate children's books, tapes or children's CD's with songs to a library.
- 4. Donate \$10 to the local Boys & Girls Club.
- 5. Donate 10 flags with the Pledge of Allegiance to local schools.
- 6. Donate 10 of anything that assists in the classroom, pencils, crayons, notebooks, tissues, hand cleaner.
- 7. A Unit could "adopt" 10 needy students and provide classroom supplies for the year.
- 8. Donate your knowledge 10 times to educate children about the flag.
- 9. Volunteer your time in the classroom or playground 10 times throughout the year the Unit could develop a schedule so all may have a chance to enjoy the time spent.
- 10. Members could volunteer to assist with a special event at the school.

POW/MIA awareness is recognized annually in September. This year National POW/MIA Recognition Day is Friday, September 16, 2016. National POW/MIA Recognition Day is not a federal public holiday in the United States but it is a national observance.

Support USO Activities in your community. Plan a visit to the USO at Sky Harbor terminal two and visit with servicemen that are passing through Phoenix.

Crime Prevention - find out how you can take part in special programs for neighborhoods and neighborhood organizations. Practicing the following personal safety tips as you go about your daily activities may make you less attractive to a would be criminal.

- BE ALERT!! Know who is near you and what activities going on around you.
- Walk with authority, look ahead and scan your surroundings
- Do not walk in poorly lit areas.
- Avoid standing at a bus stop alone, especially at night.
- If approached by someone in a car, change your direction and enter a crowded store or business.
- Carry a cell phone and some type of safety device (i.e.: flashlight, whistle, pepper spray and etc) when walking at night.
- Be alert to someone who asks for directions and/or continues to engage you in conversation.
- Obey all of the robber's orders. Keep all communication with the robber short and simple. Don't argue!
- Be identification conscious. Observe your attacker's personal appearance, type of weapon used, and type of vehicle so you can accurately describe them to police.
- Immediately report the incident to the police and do not hang up until the police arrive.

#### **Past Presidents Parley Committee**

The Past Presidents Parley is a forum that brings together the experience of our former presidents and utilizes their expertise in active service to the American Legion Auxiliary. Women who have been president of a unit, department, or the national organization are encouraged to contribute to the Auxiliary as members of the Past Presidents Parley. These leaders share their wisdom and provide ongoing mentorship to empower and bolster the Auxiliary's present leaders, ensuring the continuity and strength of the organization at all levels.

#### **Unit Past President Parley Responsibilities** •

Offer to escort a new member to your meeting. • Introduce her to the president as well as other members in attendance. Ask her to share a little about herself. The information could be helpful in determining in which committee she may have the greatest interest. Have each attendee introduce herself. • As each program report is given, request that the chairman explain the purpose of the program and how the unit supports it. Explain the duties of the officers, the chairmen and the committee members. • Help maintain a positive attitude and assist in avoiding controversy during the meeting. Interject some occasional humor to help make the meeting fun. • A prospective member is more likely to join if she feels she is joining an organization that is fun and whose activities support the community. All members will be more willing to attend meetings and assist with activities if the meetings are short and interesting. Remind the members to try new ideas without criticism if they fail. Suggest trying something else. Help keep the meeting moving toward a positive conclusion. • Evaluate your new member's capabilities. If you feel she is ready to participate, ask her which of the programs holds her greatest interest. Discourage naming a new member as an officer or a chairman, but instead suggest she be given the opportunity of working on a committee with an experienced chairman. Let her know you are willing to mentor her and assist by answering her questions. Remember to praise her efforts. • Past presidents should advise when asked, but preferably not serve as a chairman. Chairmanships should be held by other members so they may learn the programs and become good unit leaders who may develop an interest in moving into district, county or department positions. • As a past president, you may wish to promote the nomination of a Unit Member of the Year. You may take the lead in recommending servicewomen to submit for an award. Develop a fundraising activity for donations to the nursing scholarship program. • Continue to support through your ongoing leadership!
