

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

*Baptisms:* Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

#### THE EMPTY TOMB

The Devil is indeed powerful! Whoever says otherwise does so at his/her own peril. Take the events of

Returnee parishioners stared at empty tombs for weeks or even months. You, your loved one, or someone you know may be staring at an empty tomb at this moment. Tell yourself, and tell them that yes the Devil is powerful, but the power of our Risen Savior is way beyond that of the Devil. In the midst of our fears and anxieties, the Risen Savior whispers, "It is I, do not be afraid."

May the Risen Lord bring hope and joy into your life and the lives of your loved ones during this Easter Season. Amen. Alleluia.


