**ORDINARY TIME**

Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays of Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". We also may celebrate the parts of Jesus' life that were ordinary, much like our own lives.

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus telling the Parable of the Sower. The seed that is sown represents the word of God and the type of soil on which it falls is representative of the degree to which we, the listeners, are open and receptive to what we hear. As we listen to this parable, we are called to examine ourselves to see what kind of ground matches our receptivity to the word of God, and we are challenged to be the rich fertile soil which has the capacity for growth and productivity. Only if we do not allow other concerns to crowd the word of God out of our lives will it become implanted within us and bear abundant fruit in our everyday life. This week let us strive to be that rich soil in which the word of God takes root so that, in turn, we can produce good fruit in our own lives and in the lives of those around us.

**BAPTISM STIPEND - \$25.00** - Baptisms are celebrated by appointment (after a Baptism Preparation Course has been completed).

**BAPTISM PREPARATION:** The baptism of a child is a very important event in the life of the child, the child's family, and the parish community. To help parents enter more fully into the celebration of their child's baptism, St. Joseph's Parish offers a Baptism Preparation Course by appointment. Parents along with godparents are expected to attend the Baptism Preparation Course before the baptism of the child. Please call the Parish Office to register.

**MARRIAGE STIPEND - \$200.00** - Please allow at least six months between the time of contacting the Parish and the date of the Marriage. A Marriage Preparation Course is required.

**FUNERAL STIPEND - \$200.00** - St. Joseph's Parish has a Bereavement Committee which will contact you to coordinate the funeral services.

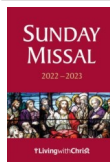
### Prayer to add to the end of the Rosary

## HEARING ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

St Joseph's Church has an FM System installed which will allow those with hearing challenges to use the system in order to improve their ability to hear the readings and prayers.

In order to use the system, you will need to obtain an FM receiver and either a headset or hearing loop from the Hospitality Ministry, when you enter the church. As we have limited numbers they will be issued on a first come basis.

**To use the headset**, plug it into the receiver and adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

**To be able to use the hearing loop**, you must have hearing aids that have a T-coil, and it needs to be activated by your hearing care professional if it is not. To determine whether you have T-coil or not, the model number for the hearing aids that have a T-coil installed will end with a T.

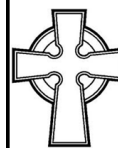
The units must be returned immediately following the liturgy.

**July 20 - Memorial of Saint Apollinaris, Bishop, Martyr:** One of the first bishops of the early Church, Apollinaris lived in the first century. During his life he was repeatedly exiled and tortured but continued to evangelize and work miracles until his martyrdom. He was one of the first great martyrs.

**July 21 - Memorial of Saint Lawrence of Brindisi, Priest, Doctor:** At the age of 16, Lawrence entered the Capuchin Franciscan order in Verona, Italy. He died in 1619, was canonized in 1881, and named Doctor of the Church in 1959.

**July 22 - Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene, Disciple of the Lord:** A faithful follower of the Lord Jesus, Mary Magdalene brought spices to anoint his body, stood near the cross after his crucifixion, and was the first witness to Christ's resurrection. Mary Magdalene is the patroness of the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans).
