## June 2015 Block of the Month: Amish Star Block

Block finishes at 12" (unfinished at 12 1/2"). Cut: White fabric: $4-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles 4-2 7/8" squares 8-2 1/2" squares 1-4 1/2" square Red fabric: $\quad 4-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles 4-2 7/8" squares
Blue fabric: 8-2 1/2" squares
Construction:
On the back of a blue $21 / 2$ " square lightly draw a diagonal line, stack the blue square right sides together and edges lined up with one end of a white $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, and sew on the line. Cut off excess $1 / 4$ " seam allowance and press the remainder towards the outer triangle. Repeat with another blue $21 / 2$ " square on the other end of the white rectangle. Repeat 3 more times.

Draw a diagonal line on the back of a $27 / 8$ " white square and with right sides together, match a red $27 / 8$ " square and sew a $1 / 4$ " on either side of the line. Cut apart on line, press open and trim to $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat 7 more times, giving you $821 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Lay out units with red and white ones in the outer ring, the blue and white ones in the middle ring, and the white 4 1/2" square in the center. Check that the units match picture and sew together. Press and measure final block. It should be 12 1/2" square.
***Remember your 1/4" seam allowance.***
You can choose to make a complete quilt top by repeating these instructions or you can set this block aside and make a sampler quilt. We look forward to seeing everyone's blocks.
