Dear Parents,

It's November, a time to be thankful for our many blessings. We are thankful for your children and your continued support of our school.

Believe it or not, November also marks the beginning of the registration process for the 2018-2019 school year. Registration for **children currently enrolled at BHPCNS** will be December 7 and 8. Applications will be available on the BHPCNS website www.bhpcns.org, after Thanksgiving. Download and complete the application. Applications should be returned to BHPCNS no earlier than December 7 and no later than December 8 in order to be given priority in enrollment. Please recognize that children currently enrolled in our 2's and 3's programs as well as those children who are enrolled in the 4's program but are not age eligible for Kindergarten are guaranteed a place, but it may not be your first choice. Acceptance is based on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Applications may be mailed or dropped off early, but they will not be processed until after those received on December 7 and 8. (See More Registration info on page 6.)

To recap October, all our students have had fun learning our classroom routines, and enjoying Creative Movement and our Music programs for the first time. Our 3s and 4s explored senses in Science. And our 3s and 4s began their weekly Spanish classes. The halls were filled with Halloween songs, including this favorite from Spanish class. 


IMPORTANCE OF PRETEND PLAY

Did you know that Scholastic Books has wonderful parent resources? Here's the first paragraph of a great article about the importance of pretend play. Young children learn by imagining and doing. Have you ever watched your child pick up a stone and pretend it is a zooming car, or hop a Lego across the table as if it were a person or a bunny? Your child is using an object to represent something else while giving it action and motion. But this pretend play is not as simple as it may seem. AND THE IMPORTANCE OF PLAY DATES

We love having your child in our classes and activities where there is lots of large group socialization. To supplement the large group experience we recommend playdates. Playdates provide children with the opportunity to play one on one with a peer, the chance to share, take turns, practice manners. These are all very important skills for our children to master. Talk with your child about who their special friends are at school and arrange a playdate at your home or the park. While a school setting provides lots of group dynamics it's important for a child to just play with a friend in an unstructured environment. OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY HELPS FINE & GROSS MOTOR DEVELOPMENT

Recently BHPCNS completed OT screenings for many of our children. Why are these screenings important? Because a child with fine and/or gross motor delays may have their learning impacted and their social development delayed because they are unable to keep up with their peers. Fine motor delays can lead to avoiding art/craft projects, and other small motor activities which further delays fine motor development. Gross motor delays can impact a child's ability to sit for stories/circle times/quiet play and impact a child's ability to run/climb on the playground, impacting their social development and self-esteem when they can't keep up with their peers.




Donuts with Dad was a huge success.

3 day 2s, Monday-Wednesday-Friday

2 day 2s, Tuesday-Thursday

Young 2s program will be determined in spring 2018 depending on space allocations.

Registration for Current BHPCNS Students:

Registration for the 2018-2019 school year will soon be underway.

- Applications will be available for current students at the BHPCNS website, <u>www.bhpcns.org</u> under the Application/Registration tab after the Thanksgiving break. Hard copies will also be coming home in your chil'ds tote bag.
- Download an application, or collect one in the office, complete the information, and return the form on either December 7 or December 8. Returning students must have their applications turned in no later than Friday, December 8 to guarantee placement.
- Remember to indicate a first and second choice. While we guarantee placement for students currently enrolled in our 2 and 3-year-old programs and for students enrolled in the 4s who do not meet the age eligibility for public school kindergarten, we do not guarantee your first choice.
- Acceptance is based on a first-come, first-served basis. The earlier you submit your application, the greater your chances of being accepted into your first choice program.
- Applications received before December 7 will be placed after those received on December 8.

Registration for Siblings Not Currently Enrolled in BHPCNS:

October and November are the months to submit applications for siblings of currently enrolled students who will attend BHPCNS for the first time beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. Applications are available in the office and online for your children who will be starting BHPCNS in September 2018. Registration for currently enrolled students will begin in December. Acceptance or Wait List notifications will be sent home in January.

New Applicants to BHPCNS:

Encourage your friends and neighbors to call the office to learn more and schedule a tour of BHCPNS. New families say they chose Bradley Hills because their friend, neighbor, co-worker spoke highly of our program. We love that you love us! Help us spread the word about what a wonderful place BHCPNS is for children to play, grow, and learn! Applications are available online for new students.

BHPCNS follows Montgomery County Public Schools with regard to birthdate cut-off dates for admission. Children must be 2 by September 1, 2018 to enroll in the 2s, 3 by September 1, 2018, to enroll in the 3s, and 4 by September 1, 2018 to enroll in the 4s. 
Music Class 2s, 3s, and 4s

They will all have the opportunity to become a firefighter to the song "Hurry, Hurry Drive the Firetruck" which, by the way, is the children's favorite song! For the 3s and 4s

Mrs. Cardoni Shares: We're so sorry October is over and we've said *Adios* to the Monstruos song! In November, we'll continue to build our vocabulary. We'll learn the names of family members (mother-*madre*, father-*padre*, siblings-*hermanos*, grandparents-*abuelos*). We'll be learning the names of the food we'll see on the Thanksgiving table.
