### Phase V Board of Directors Meeting May 10, 2017

Meeting was called to order by President Bill Charles at 1:07 p.m.

All board members were present and 17, Phase V residents were in attendance. Meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes from last meeting were approved as written ,without ,comment or corrections.

Jim Reushlein, gave the financial report for the month of April 2017, we are actually a little under budget at this time. However, we have not begun the repairs of painting, cement, gardening sprinklers and building repairs as yet. At the time of the meeting the damage from the storm on the roofs, buildings, trees, etc., Jim is still waiting for the insurance company to come back with the amount they will cover and a okay to begin the repairs. budget was off about a \$1,000.00 mostly due to a water increase that had not been figured when doing the budget.

The nest collection from the geese was a total of 22 eggs from 5 nests. 2 nests seemed to have been missed by the geese laying later than the DNR date given for allowed collection.

A request was granted to give our annual donation of \$300.00 to the gardening group of 1-1V to beautify the entrance into our complex.

Management report was given and approved with Cindy asking for approval and myself for seconding. The report included 3 units for sale. One on Arlington Cir for \$84,900. One on Lexington for \$89,900. and one on Yorktown for \$84,900. Aged receivables are \$4,728.55. mostly just 1 month delinquencies with late charges or fines.

Paul Tralla's additional charges for the month were \$1,283.88. which included replacement of all street signs hot water heater replacements, thermos couplers, gas valves, and miscellaneous repairs. Approval by the board was also given to Paul to purchase10 additional Water heaters before a price increase this summer.

The walk around inspections have been completed. We will begin the wood replacement program this month and anticipate completing six wood buildings and six vinyl buildings this year. The Board has been researching the cost and value added of replacement of wood buildings to vinyl. This will be discussed as we get even further along on our studies and plausibility's of being able to achieve this for the benefits of our current and future residents. We have also be working on updating the Rules and Regulations. We hope to have all the additions and deletions. completed and printed by June and ready for Implementation by August 2017. Don't forget next Board meeting will be a evening meeting as requested. (hope to see you there).

Our new pool crew...( Debbie and Katie) have gone to training and are ready and anxious to begin our season! We should be open by the end of the month as anticipated.

#### Perfect Fried Chicken

1

whole chicken cut up. 2 qts Buttermilk 1 tbls Paprika 3 c. Flour 2/3 c. canola oil or veg. Oil3 tsp salt1/4 tsp pepper11/2 tsp fresh sage & thyme chopped fine.

1. In a lg. Bowl add buttermilk, 2tsp salt & pepper mix well

2. Place in refrigerator & marinate 1 hr. But best when marinated overnight.

3. Remove chicken letting any excess liquid drip off. Toss chicken in flour mix making sure it is well coated.

4. Tap off excess flour. Carefully drop in hot oil. Important not to over-crowd the pan. Allow to brown.5. Place chicken on a wire rack with paper towels underneath. Cool some. Stays crispy. Cool 5 minutes to rest & serve.

### If You Have Diabetes, Do You "Know Your Numbers?"

As of 2016, more than 29 million Americans were living with diabetes and 86 million were living with pre-diabetes. Type I diabetes occurs when a patient's body doesn't produce enough insulin to lower his/her blood sugar to normal levels. On the other hand, type II diabetes occurs when a patient's body doesn't respond properly to insulin. These patients have what is commonly referred to as 'insulin resistance,' meaning their body produces insulin but their tissues and don't respond organs to that insulin appropriately. This type of diabetes is much more common and is lifestyle-induced. If you have been diagnosed with diabetes or prediabetes, here are several important numbers that you should be familiar with to manage your condition.

- Hemoglobin A1C (pronounced A-onesee): An average measure of your blood sugar over the past 90 days. A normal A1C (someone without diabetes) is below 5.7%. A patient with pre-diabetes has an A1C of 5.7 to 6.4%. An A1C of 6.5% or greater indicates diabetes.
- <u>100 mg/dL</u>: A normal fasting (8 hours without eating) blood sugar reading for someone without diabetes.

- < 70 mg/dL: Low blood sugar (hypoglycemia). When a patient's blood sugar gets to this level he/she will likely feel sweaty, shaky, nauseous, and have a rapid heartbeat (tachycardia).
- 4. <u>Yearly</u>: Patients with diabetes should have a comprehensive eye exam by an optometrist or ophthalmologist every year. Diabetes is the leading cause of adult blindness. Excess blood glucose is believed to change proteins throughout the body, including the eyes, which can lead to retinopathy.
- <u>5-10%</u>: It has been shown that losing 5-10% of your body weight can help prevent/delay type II diabetes. Aim for at least 150 minutes/week of moderate physical activity. Not only will this lower your blood sugar, but also your blood pressure and cholesterol.

### **History in Your Backyard**

#### The New Old South Lyon Hotel: Bigger, Better Next Month

We all know what happened to our old "Buck Board" meeting place last year. The creaky South Lyon Hotel was wiped out. Virtually to the ground.

If all goes according to plan, Phase V'ers looking to head back to the hotel that's been a downtown South Lyon fixture since 1867, will be able to do just that in late July, says its co-owner Chris Baker. Baker also owns Baker's of Milford and the Comeback Inn in Highland.

So, instead of urging you all go get out of your chairs and explore the state this month, I'm urging you all to get out of your chairs and explore your town, and be one of the first to enter the New South Lyon Hotel. Here's part of what you'll find.

Some opening specials may just include that "Buck Board," featuring several lunch items for one dollar that was a favorite of Colonial Acres residents. In fact, at least a dozen or so made it a point to visit weekly for that special before the fire ended those meetings temporarily. When it reopens, you'll recognize some old touches, and definitely some improvements, Baker said.

Originally built on the site of an old cemetery—yup, an old cemetery the Commercial House was heated by four large fireplaces.

When trains stopped, the hotel's buckboard would race competitors to the station to lure travelers to its table fare and rooms, hence the term Buck Board. Each week, when those one-dollar items were on the menu, Phase V'ers regularly held court until the old watering hole went up in a late night fire last June, with no loss of life.

When you return, which may happen as soon as late July, you'll notice lots of positive changes besides the new building. First among them is that you won't need to climb the steps up to the front porch to get inside. Entry will be at street level, even though the patios on both first and second floors will still be part of the look, Baker said.

The kitchen, where the fire is presumed to have started, will now be on the building's north side. If you don't want to or can't use the stairs, an elevator will also bring you to the second floor dining areas and patio.

The interior layout will be more open, allowing for easier access and more seating and you can choose from a menu that will be similar to the pre-fire version, with a few new items as well.

The same chef and many of the staff, will be returning to serve you.

And, good news for us, Baker said he'll soon be working on how he and co-owner Corry Bala can retain those inexpensive Buck Board specials. He also hinted that there may also be special, just-for-us pricing on some items to welcome Colonial Acres residents back through its doors.

"We're trying to keep some of the old look to it, but it will be modern, match the rest of downtown's buildings, and will be there for a long, long time. The big bad wolf's not blowing this one down," Baker said.

Watch for updates on the hotel's anticipated grand opening in next month's edition.

### If a Pet Fish is No Longer Wanted By Denise Semion

Is it OK to set unwanted aquatic pets free in a public pond or river? No, says the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR). Each year the MDNR receives numerous reports of unique species showing up in waterbodies throughout the state. I remember a piranha reported in Stony Creek Lake at Stony Creek Metropark once posing such a problem.

How these species, like that former pet piranha, got into the water can be a mystery, but one method is 100-percent preventable: don't dump a fish or other aquatic pets into public waters.

"Pet release is almost never humane. Pets released from confined, artificial environments are poorly equipped to fend off predators and may be unable to successfully forage for food or find shelter," said Nick Popoff, manager of the DNR's Aquatic Species and Regulatory Affairs Unit.

Dumping fish or other aquatic animals into public waterbodies is illegal, as doing so requires a permit from the state of Michigan. This includes the release of aquarium fish like goldfish or pacus, or farm-raised fish from private ponds.

"If your fish or other species has outgrown its tank or has begun to feed on your other fish, you should consider donating or trading it with another hobbyist, an environmental learning center, an aquarium or a zoo," said Jo Latimore with Michigan State University Extension and RIPPLE.

Additionally, you can often check with the store where you purchased the fish or species to see if they will take it back.




