Soaring to New Heights in Membership Trophy Rules of Award Process

General:

Recruiting events submitted by the Post must reflect an all time high of acquired members for any one event in the community. The event MUST be held away from the Post home. If a Post shows interest in this contest -Thinking outside of the Box, means that the Post must work the program in their community and not in their Post home. The goal is to promote our Posts in our communities; membership will come.

The 2018 National Commander Denise Rohan stated, "We need to work as a Family." The easiest successes come by relying upon all of the Post Family Entities. If a Rider Chapter member is not present, please remember to notify the Post's Rider Officers of new prospects for their program.

Eligibility:

Eligibility is open to all American Legion Family Entities to achieve the award for the Post Family.

A member of the Department Membership Committee should be in attendance at the event to verify the number of members gained were joined at the event. These officers are listed in the Department Directory; i.e., District Commander or others.

The latest event eligible is not later than 30 days prior to Department to allow time for reports to arrive to Department for New Member enrollment and event confirmations.

Deadline:

Event closing is Not later than 30 days prior to Department Convention Opening day. The Post which has recruited the highest quantity of members in ONE event by even one member higher than all other Posts is awarded the Soaring to New Heights Trophy for one full year. A Post may conduct as many events as desired to achieve the highest submission.

Process:

- 1. Plan the event. Request the presence of Department Membership Committee. Conduct the event. Suggestion: Assign one team to manage all the actual new member sign-ups and dues collection. This way, the other event volunteers can focus on making the event a great experience and if a visitor decides to inquire about membership, they can be directed to the sign-up team for closing the deal.
- 2. Complete the Entry Form below. Make a copy of the entry form for future Post use. Submit the fully completed form to Department Headquarters through regular channels, confirming receipt as a practice.
- 3. When filling out the Entry Form have Department Membership Committee verify the event on the form. Invite him/her to participate at the event. Let him/her note the exact date of the event and which members of the Legion Family gave support.
- **4.** Remember to use information on your Consolidated Post Report. (CPR)
- 5. This trophy will migrate to the next year's awarded Post. Any Post that wins the trophy for three consecutive years is invited to keep the Trophy. A new similar trophy will enter into its place, purchased by the "three-peat" awarded Post.

The numbers are in for 2016/2017 statistics, posted on the National website. Poppy or poppy items distributed were 5,774,659 for a total of \$3,915,653. There were 4,692 veterans who made poppies and they were paid a total of \$316,201.

Veteran's Day is November 11th. It falls on Saturday so it's a great weekend to distribute poppies. All Legion Family members are encouraged to join in the distribution. Remind people the poppy is a symbol of our dedication to honor and provide services for our veterans and active duty military personal. If you're near a military Post or Base, let the soldiers know who we are and what we do. Most don't know their family has us to turn to in time of financial crisis. It provides peace of mind and a sense that others care. The donations are used for "a veteran's family" meaning immediate family and dependents who live with them. It doesn't include family not living with the veteran or the family of a deceased veteran. In some situations poppy funds can be used for scholarships. Please see the Poppy Guide pamphlet for more detailed information on this.

Educate! Public awareness is important. Emblem sales has helpful items, utilize them.

We no longer have to use only crepe paper poppies. We can now distribute the poppy symbol in non traditional ways such as T- shirts, cookies, Christmas decorations etc. The poppy image should always be red as it symbolizes the blood sacrificed for our freedom. Other than the 'In Memoriam" poppy image, ALA does not own other poppy images. If an item doesn't have a Legion family emblem on it, approval isn't needed. With any Legion emblem, it's considered "branded" and needs approval from the National secretary.

The 'In Memoriam" tag no longer has a date on it so any poppies left over from last year can still be used.

Poppy Posters. For your poster to be considered for the Western Division Judging, I must have it no later than April 19, 2018 in order for their chairman to have it on time.

Your mid year report form will be in your Conference packet. Please return your report to me no later than Nov. 27, 2017. I have a deadline for my report also.

VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 9-30-17

American Legion Auxiliary Units sponsor Bingo parties which are held on the third Saturday of each month at 1:30PM in Building 60 at the VA hospital. Volunteers are needed to assist with this activity, which is much appreciated by our hospitalized Veterans. Please consider sponsoring the Bingo program. Thank you to the past & current District presidents who volunteered at the June Bingo. We are now welcoming Veteran patients from the Building 95 Substance Use Treatment Disorder Program to our Bingos.

The American Legion Auxiliary Units sponsor Bridging Ceremony refreshments for the Substance Use Disorders Treatment Program (SUDTP) on the third Tuesday of each month and any month that there is a fifth Tuesday. We sponsored refreshments on September 19th, 2017. We will be sponsoring refreshments on October 17th & October 31st, 2017. Volunteers are needed to help with this program. The time is 2PM and the venue is Building 90 at the VA hospital. Thank you to members of Unit 131 & 132 who have volunteered to help with this program. Special thanks to Fire Woman and Jude for all their assistance with this activity.

The new Residential Mental Health Rehabilitation facility is now open. This added 25 new beds to house Veterans in various treatment programs with on-site housing on the hospital campus. Previously these Veterans were bussed to and from residential shelters. This facility will allow for additional supervision of Veteran patients and it is felt that this will contribute to their success in the program. This facility is requesting clear backpacks (25 per month) and water bottles (25 per month). The staff requesting these donations has put forward that donations in kind, rather than monetary donations, would best fill this need. Units 102, 131, 132, 109 and District 2 have responded to this need and we ordered 250 backpacks and water bottles in July.

Veterans Creative Arts meeting was held at SAVAHCS on Wednesday, June 14, 2017. This chairman attended the meeting with SAVAHCS personnel and members from the Southern Arizona Arts & Cultural Alliance who will be collaborating with the committee in an effort to expand this program in Tucson. SAACA attended the quarterly VAVS meeting on July 26, 2017 to discuss their participation in this program and to encourage all service organizations to participate in this program. This representative will be meeting with the committee again within the next thirty days.

The grand total of monetary donations by American Legion Auxiliary Units for May 1, 2017 to September 30, 2017 is \$6,338.13. Thank you Unit 66 for your generous donation.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2017 to September 30, 2017 is \$19,973.00. We would like to express special thanks to Elaine Yates and Yuma Unit 19, Ann Reatherford, Unit 24, Unit 131, Unit 132, Unit 73 and Unit 109 members and unaffiliated volunteers for their constant support of VA programs through their donations. The Legion family is the largest supporter of the Arizona Fisher House. Currently, Arizona Fisher House is funded for the foreseeable future. Other programs are in dire need of donations (ie. Homeless, Building 95, Social Services, Bingo, etc.).

Fifteen registered hospital volunteers and ten summer youth volunteers, donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2017 to September 30, 2017 is 2,699; occasional volunteer hours are 56 donated by fourteen occasional volunteers. We are now down to fourteen registered volunteers at SAVAHCS. Please consider volunteering at SAVAHCS if you can possibly devote the time. We have one new American Legion Auxiliary registered volunteer.

This chairman has volunteered 141 hours and logged 1,740 miles this year in service to the Tucson VA Medical Center as of September 30, 2017. This chairman has completed her second term on the Executive Committee as vice president for the VAVS Committee at SAVAHCS. Deputy Ann Reatherford was elected to the Executive Committee at the quarterly meeting on July 26, 2017. Her term will begin in October, 2017 and she will be serving for two years.

UAV Unofficial Minutes 7 October 2017

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairman Reggie Yates. The open ceremony was conducted and guests introduced.

DAV Commander John Burden gave a report on what the DAV has been doing and what his goals are for his organization. He is requesting copies of other organizational newsletters so he can make sure all information dealing with the veterans community is given its widest dissemination. He is also reestablishing the DAV Ritual Team.

Honor Flight Board of Director Diane Franzese and Mel Brody, participant of an Honor Flight gave a report on their program. This program was initiated by Susan Hough. The take 10 flights a year, five in the spring and five in the fall. They are looking for Veterans from WWII, Korean War and Vietnam for the upcoming flights. To obtain an application go to honorflight.org and return it to their organization for consideration. They also need guardians. The cost to the guardians is \$900 and covers all expenses. Mel Brody gave a report on his Honor Flight trip.

Humana Inc. Health Care, Donna Bell gave a presentation on the efforts they are making to help make veterans healthier. So far they have help 20% each year. They also have a program for veterans desiring to start their own business. They volunteer to help grow Veterans Organizations. Humana Inc. has replaced United Health Care.

Carol Culbertson took the roll, the minutes were presented and a motion was made to accept the minutes as written, second and approved.

Bob Hysko gave the financial report.

Danielle, a representative from Ruben Gallego's office was introduced.

Shawn from the VA Medical Center thanked everyone for their input to help improve the VA medical facilities. He gave an update on Ms. Nelson's recent travels to Washington D.C. Last physical year the VA medical facilities spent \$744 million on improvements. Their policy is "Vets First" and will continue to be their goal. The new dental clinic is due to open later this month. They are 17 doctors short in the Primary Care area for treatment. There is a shortage also nationwide. They are looking for 30 doctors to fill 17 positions. The hope is to have doctors available to fill vacancies as they come so that they do not encounter a shortage in this area. If they run out of money the will go back to DC and ask for more. They do not want to jeopardize treatment because of financial issues.

To keep up their transparency policy, they will be inviting the media in to answer any questions they may have.

Wanda Wright, Director ADVS advised the membership that the State Legislature has provided \$4 million more for Veterans Care at the State Homes and they can now fill the vacant beds. In the State of Arizona 50% of veterans are over 60 years of age. The northern region veterans counselors have seen 100 veterans through skype. They have put together kits to help veterans gain employment. These kits can include up to \$750 for purchase of proper attire, transportation, etc. to help them. They also provide a training program to assist corporations in how to hire veterans. The Phoenix home has reduced the falls by 20%. The Tucson home was given a 5 star rating and is one of the top 5 veterans homes in the country. There will be a week long seminar starting November 4th, 2017, free to veterans seeking employment. For more information go to heovona.com.

"Be Connected" is a new program in the state to combat suicide. Arizona stats are three times higher than the National Stats. The hot line is 866-4AZ VETS (866-429=8387) and is manned 24/7. The crisis line is state wide. Encourage veterans to call for help. Resourcecomand.org has helped over 400 veterans on this line.

Reggie Yates gave a report from the Board of Directors. They are looking for a larger space for the monthly meetings. He further advised that the VA & AZDVS website has loads of information dealing with veteran's issues and programs.

Reggie also advised the membership that the selections have been made for the Spring Gala awards but the names have not officially be released.

Elections are coming up and Reggie stated that anyone desiring to serve in leadership rolls for the UAV please contact Rob Welsh.

Judy Hatch gave an update on Pearl Harbor Day. It appears that the Governor will be with us this day since Hawaii will not be having a program at their memorial. She encouraged everyone to plan on attending and requested those able to walk a short distance park on the west side of the Capitol building and walk across since parking is limited at Wesley Bolin Plaza. She provide a list of those organization that have and have not responded for the wreath ceremony.

Terry Araman gave the legislative report. Remarked about the MFRF and stated plans are being made to readdress this issue.

NEW BUSINESS: Nominations for the Class of 20118 AVHOF will open on Saturday, October 28, 2017.

After the November 4th meeting a seminar will be held on how to wright a nomination for the AVHOF. Another on will be conducted on Saturday, February 4th. In addition workshops will be conducted in major cities throughout the State.
