Today we hear the central teaching of our faith encapsulated in one sentence: *Love God with all our heart, being, strength and mind and your neighbor as yourself.* Then to illustrate this summary statement of faith, we hear the story of the Good Samaritan. Sometimes those who need to be helped want help on their own terms. Our story today reminds us that help may come from the most unforeseen or even unimaginable people. When we place limitations on even such things as who might lend us help or assistance, we might not be open to the mercy of God, which is extended in a variety of ways. Although this parable of the Good Samaritan is often read to mean we should be neighborly and act mercifully, it can also be read in a way so that we are open to receive mercy and kindness from others, no matter who they might be. Jesus invites us to move beyond ourselves in moments of crisis and to be open to mercy from wherever it might come. In doing so, we abandon our own preconceived notions and live with an openness broader than we had before. As the listeners long ago learned, we too must remember, that a Christian life is not limited to something we do, it is a way of being.

On June 30<sup>th</sup> we completed our fiscal year at the parish. Our Sunday collections totaled 102% of our projected budget for the year. We finished with a total of \$382,715.59. This represents \$5,500 increase over last year and \$6,400.00 over our projected budget for this year. Thank you so much for your continued support and generosity to our parish. This truly is a tribute to all of you and your on-going generosity and kindness. Currently, we are beginning to work on our year-end reports for the Diocese and once completed, I will provide a summary of our current financial status. Look for this sometime in mid-September. Again, I would like to offer my sincerest thanks and appreciation for your commitment to stewardship and support of the parish. It is a welcomed relief to be able to continue to operate our parish in a positive balance and to remain current on all of our obligations, maintenance and upkeep of our property and buildings.

It is hard to believe how fast the summer is moving along. As we reach this halfway point I hope it continues to be a good time for you and your family. Be safe and enjoy the warm weather, long days and bright sunshine!!

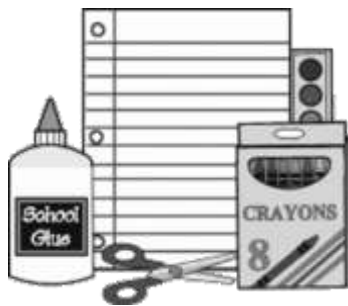
