It's Election Time...

For The American Legion, Advocacy is not Partisanship!

Ever since its founding at the end of World War I, one of the primary roles of The American Legion has been to advocate for legislation that benefits Veterans, both at the Federal and State levels.

Annually, Legionnaires gather in Washington, DC; their State Capitols and in their local municipalities to educate their representatives (Federal, State and Local) about suggested ideas for proposed legislation that will benefit members of The American Legion and the greater Veterans community at large. These activities include meeting with legislators and other elected officials in their local districts.

Because of The American Legion's tax status, what the organization does not do is endorse, or in any other way, promote or contribute to any publicly elected official in the name of The American Legion, either directly or indirectly. This does not mean that American Legion Posts or Districts cannot invite elected officials to their meetings to educate Legionnaires on relevant Veteran issues.

One important example of TAL (The American Legion) advocacy in action happened at the August 28, 2020 Department of California Executive Committee meeting. At that meeting, the DEC approved three resolutions OPPOSING November election Ballot Measures: Proposition: 15 (Increase Property Tax) would increase on small and commercial businesses. Proposition: 21 (Rent Control) would repeal rent control measures and create barriers for low income and homeless Veterans. Proposition 23: (Dialysis Availability) would interrupt dialysis care for individuals with kidney failure and need treatment three days a week; many Veterans with kidney failure would be impacted in a negative way.

It is important that Legionnaires, Auxiliary, SAL and AL Riders members get out and vote on the important issues of the day. This is our right as citizens. It is equally important to remember that the Legion is non-partisan and does not promote any single party or candidate. We do, as an organization, advocate on legislation that will have a direct impact on our fellow Veterans and their families. We are always in service to our Veteran community.


On election day, make sure your voice is heard. Please get out and vote.

Greetings Everyone,


We hope this finds everyone in good health and happy in spite of this God awful Covid 19 Virus.
