

# Fourth Sunday of Advent (year A) Sunday 18 December 2022

# "Emmanuel – God with Us"

The hope of the Hebrew people has always been that God would forever be with them. In times of struggle, they longed for the day when they would experience their prayer for God's presence and intervention answered.

Over the past weeks of Advent, the Church through our Liturgies has presented the prophet Isaiah's visions of a new world, keeping alive in times of oppression and exile the faithful promise that God would be with them and through them would establish a kingdom of peace and justice that would eventually reach out to the ends of the earth. The Gospel readings of this year come from Matthew. Today's reading concerning 'how Jesus Christ came to be born' expresses the community's faith for which Matthew wrote. This community of Jewish Christians were anxious to persuade those with whom they shared the traditions of Israel that Jesus was the long awaited one — the fulfilment of the vision of the prophets. Joseph's dream of an angelic herald announcing a child to be born to Mary his betrothed identifies the one to come as Emmanuel" — meaning "God with us', Matthew invited his people to recognize that God's promise, "I will be your God and you will be my people" embedded in the scriptures and personified by their forefathers Abraham, Jacob, Moses, David the humble shepherd King and voiced by the prophets through their times of trial, embedded faith and hope beyond all imagining.

God's presence was not only <u>with them</u> but closer than they could imagine. It was <u>in</u> human life through its struggles, sufferings, hopes, joys and events- that God was to be sought, celebrated and shared with others.

Today we hear of God being present <u>in</u> the one called Jesus who was to be born to a woman called 'Mary', raised and nurtured by two humble but deeply faithful, trusting and compassionate human beings and who would, during His mission, identify with and proclaim God's love for the poor, exiled and outcast, drawing all into the embrace and hospitality of God.

Whatever account of the birth of Jesus we read Matthew's or Luke's -the fundamental message is about "God with us" now.

As we reflect on this truth we might become more attentive to the 'us' and how we are with each other. This is the most precious gift about which Christmas reminds us. Like Joseph and Mary journeying to Bethlehem the home of Joseph's ancestry, many of us will gather at a family home to recall our past, celebrate our present and share our hopes for the future. 'Being with' is about sharing life with each other, and being supported in a family, celebrating with our faith community, welcoming a new comer, attending to a person in need, supporting a refugee, inviting into our family one who lives alone, shedding an embittered ego or mending a broken relationship. It is about

sharing in the hospitality of God

"If only one broken relationship could be mended," sister Clare Condon SGS says, "our Christmas- our 'God with us' would be real for one other person."

O Wisdom that comes out of the mouth of the Most High, that reaches from one end to another, and orders all things mightily and sweetly, come to teach us the way of prudence!



#### GOSPEL

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph; being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son

and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means 'God-is-with-us.' When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.
