

For the past 82 years our members have continued to serve and volunteer toward our ministry commitment in our faith journey together. Immanuel continues to remain an asset in our community. As I look back on 2022, I am proud of the ministries our small church family has accomplished. Thank you, our members, for your support and dedication to our church ministry. Without YOU, Immanuel would not be able to continue and carry on as an asset in our community. Your time, talents and generosity are greatly appreciated.

This past year our worship routines had somewhat returned to normal. We remained cautious when serving communion, sharing peace, offered pre-filled communion cups and continued to offer an outdoor drive-in service.


Can you believe Pastor Karen has been with us over two years! Our Congregational Church Council was pleased to offer Pastor Karen an extension of her contract for another two years. Thank you, Pastor Karen, for enriching our lives with your teachings of the Gospel and leading us in worship each week. I am grateful for your leadership throughout our faith journey. Our worship attendance remains steady and we are happy to host visitors. However, we were saddened by the loss of several faithful, dedicated members during the past year.



We ended the year meeting our financial obligations and budget. This summer Immanuel applied for membership to the Erie Community Foundation and we held our first ever Erie

Gives campaign in August. We received a check from the Foundation for donations and matching monies for \$10,339.41. Immanuel was also able to meet our Congregational Commitment to the Northwest Synod of the ELCA. Funds for the boiler campaign increased to \$23,113.68 toward our goal of \$58,803. Thank you to our Treasurer, Bill Redditt for his financial expertise and the countless hours he spends writing checks and balancing our treasury each month.

In June, we held our first ever indoor rummage sale as a fundraiser for the boiler fund. Proceeds raised were \$2,130.40. Although it was a little bit of work, our church family had lots of laughs and fun planning, pricing and selling. Thank you all however you helped for making this a successful fundraiser project. As they say, "One man's trash is another man's TREASURE!" The two bake and book sales held in 2022 were also very successful and our

Soup Cookoff in February. Our members are truly enjoying the coffee hour the first Sunday of the month. The Little Food Pantry continues to be used by those in need. I appreciate all the food collection assistance from the neighborhood community for helping us keep the pantry filled. Many thanks to the "It's close enough" quilting group for their record year in sending out

114 quilts to Ukraine and Lutheran World Relief. We are appreciative of the Thrivent monies received by members for use in purchasing quilt batting and items for the Community Shelter bags.

I am grateful for our Property Committee for making sound decisions for maintaining our church grounds and rental properties. Our rental properties generate revenue for our treasury and it is important we maintain our houses to remain productive assets for Immanuel. This year we replaced the furnace in the 10th street house and will add AC in the spring. This past July, we were able to rent the 10th street property within days. Rental rates were increased on both properties to help cover increased costs of taxes and insurance.

Thank you to our Worship & Music Committee, Music Director, Choir and Altar Guild who continue to inspire us through beautiful music, messages and presentation. It was great to have the return of Beer & Hymns at Brewerie this year. I am thankful for the continuing efforts of the Christian



Education Committee for their offerings of Adult Sunday School and Confirmation classes. Join me in praying that our youth will return so we may mold them to be disciples of Christ. It was great to see the Hat & Mitten trees so full this year and who can resist Pretzel Sunday!

Thank you to our Stewardship Committee for tallying our pledges and time and talent sheets.

Social Ministry 2022 Report

The year began with a collection of \$168 for Lutheran Disaster Response to help with the tornadoes that damaged the midwest. The Holy Trinity Pasta and Soup Kitchen benefitted from our "Souper" Bowl collection of \$528. We made up 52 personal care kits for Lutheran World Relief. Each kit included a bath towel, two bars of soap, toothbrush, comb and nail clippers. Harding Elementary and our own teacher Alli Lee were given school supplies that were generously given by our members. After a 2 year hiatus, the Sloppy Joe dinner at Holy Trinity took place the last Thursday in October. We made and collected items for the men and women staying at the Community Shelter at Christmas. Our members made tote bags, hats and scarves for each person along with gloves, socks, washcloths, hand sanitizer, candy, comb, paper and pens, lip balm, hand warmers, hand cream, razors, and a 5 day bus pass.

Many thanks go to the people who donated money and items for these projects. Special thanks to Cindy Eckman for obtaining a Thrivent grant to help cover the cost of the bus passes. Bob and Donna Dorler, Joe and Anita Byrne, Debbie Redditt, Pastor Kostur, George and Sue Pfeiffer for helping at the Sloppy Joe dinner. Thank you to Denise Arnold, for sewing the tote bags and scarves, Debbie Redditt, Cindy Eckman, Donna Dorler and Judy Stewart for helping sew the hats. Tom and Judy Stewart for helping put together personal care kits and the items for the Christmas bags.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT- 2022

Improvements and Changes – Covid-19 has changed our lives. Both of the church's rental properties are currently rented. Our 10th street tenants have brought items to our attention that needed work (electric to garage, floor replacement of upstairs toilet and problems with heating). A new furnace has been installed in the 10th Street house. AC will be added to the house this year.

We asked our tenants if they are willing to pay extra for mowing. Our caretaker is willing to mow for a fee paid directly to him. Rental contracts are reviewed and updated to protect us. The contractor we use for plowing the parking lot has been doing an excellent job for us and is cautious to minimize damage to our property. We have a lawn weed & feed service doing our yard that makes it look good but makes the grass grow too fast.

Future concerns - Do we need a space in the church for the handicapped? Our church sign needs to be serviced & repaired. Windows in the educational wing of the church need attention. Glazing has deteriorated and needs replaced and painted. Energy conservation is always on our mind. What do we need to do to make our church more inviting. There has been some concern about church upkeep, when there are times or circumstances beyond our control. We as a congregation need to step up and do the tasks that we can do. The committee is always trying to do what is needed at Immanuel to preserve our legacy. As always it is a matter of funding, time and people-power to address church issues. The concerns and/or suggestions you may have are always welcomed by the committee. If any particular cleaning or maintenance issue arises, a note may be left in the office for the custodian, talk to him personally or to a Property committee member.

Remember our church home is like your home except we don't live there. We are merely tenants entrusted with upkeep. There is always something that needs to be done. We still have to be welcoming to others in our church. Our witness as a church in this community has been to provide a safe place for outside groups. How secure can we make the church and yet be accessible? We must have trust and faith in others and ourselves.

Thanks and praise to God for all that has been entrusted to us and thanks to all who volunteer their time and effort to make this all happen. A special thanks to Walter Coughlin, our employed custodian for all his extra time in service to us. During the Covid-19 pandemic. he sanitizes between services.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The included 2022 Treasurer's Report Statement of Activity for the year ending December 31, 2022 compares our actual 2022 Revenue and Expenses to our 2022 Budget.

- 2022 Offerings of \$79,030 were 7% above budget (\$5,650 above budget) and 4% below 2021 offerings (\$3,452 below budget).
- Rental income for 2022 was below budget by \$945 due a three-week vacancy at the 10th Street property. Both rental houses are currently occupied. Rental rates were increased in August 2022 to cover increased costs for real estate taxes and improvements.
- All other expense categories were within budget, except for Church/Property repairs and maintenance (New furnace/Air Conditioner in 10th Street Rental house completed in December 2022), and Benevolence Expense which was \$1,889 above budget (most of the additional benevolence expenses were offset by designated member contributions).
