Pastor's Word

What a gift it was to experience a time of sabbatical this summer! Thank you to all of you for your encouragement and grace in offering this time away. What did I do these last few months? I'll be sharing some of my experiences and learnings in the weeks ahead, but here is a quick capsule:

I worked on genealogy and visited some cemeteries in southern Illinois with my mom and sisters. I also visited a couple of pioneer cemeteries, including Old Ruff Cemetery (great name!), where I found the graves of my 5x great-grandparents, John and Sarah Curry Hall. John served in the Revolutionary War. I actually found the military marker for John; he was one of the first settlers in the area and was buried on the property years before the cemetery was started. I made some interesting family history discoveries over the summer and had a large 7-generation family tree printed.

We were able to have more extended visits with family than is typically the case, and living as far from family as we do, this was a blessing. I went to church with my mom on Mother's Day, was injured playing Cornhole during some friendly family competition (not seriously, but I had never heard of anyone being injured playing Cornhole so I have that distinction), and we enjoyed time with family in Arkansas and Indiana.

Having a break from the usual responsibilities of ministry allowed me to have a restful time. Susan and I stayed at a cabin on Lake Superior. I enjoyed hiking to several waterfalls there. The setting was beautiful and it was nice to just watch the water and hear the waves. I got up at 5 am to see the spectacular sunrises (and then went back to bed.)

It was also nice to experience worship without being "in charge." I visited several churches in person as well as taking in worship services online. God is at work and good things are happening in all kinds of places. Given the large number of folks who worship with us on Zoom, I was especially interested in how congergations are doing online worship and how those at home are being included in services. You will be hearing more about that.



Toward the end of the sabbatical I bought an electric bicycle. This has been great fun and also a good way to get around – I'll be commuting to church a good bit. It is like riding a regular bike except that the hills and wind are no longer a factor. I suppose this is a nod to the fact that I'm not as young as I used to be, but it is a good way to get exercise and I can ride to the church and not show up all sweaty.

The past 3 months have been a great experience for me, and I hope they have been a good experience for the church as well. We had a great lineup of guest preachers and while I definitely wasn't checking up on you, I nevertheless heard glowing reports on what was happening over the summer. Thank you to all who stepped up and took on added responsibility – to the deacons and others who have provided pastoral care, to all who served as worship leaders and planners, to our Music Director Mindy and Office Manager Charyl for taking on more during this time, to Randall, Phyllis, and John who helped fill the pulpit along with outside guests, to Jerilyn who took on added technology responsibilities, and to all who helped to make things work smoothly. Hopefully this was a reminder to all of us – myself included – that we are all called to ministry, using our gifts in God's service.
