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## **Rising 2nd Grade Summer Reading Activities**

*Choose one book from the required reading list. After reading your chosen book, complete one of the activities listed below. Your activity will be due the first week of September.*

### **Activity Option 1 - Design Your Own T-Shirt**

Illustrate a scene or character from the book on a t-shirt. Write a short summary of the scene and explain why it is important to the story. If you choose to illustrate a character, write a description of the character and why he or she is important to the story.

### **Activity Option 2 - Create a Mobile from Items Related to the Story**

Select (10) items that represent people, places, events, or other parts of the book and hang them from a clothes hanger using string or yarn. Write a key that explains the relation of each item to the story.

### **Activity Option 3 - Make a New Book Jacket for the Book**

Front cover: Draw and color an illustration for the book.

Inside front flap: Write descriptions of the main characters.

Inside back flap: Write a description of the setting and a short summary of the book.

Back cover: Write 5-10 quotes from the book that are important to understanding the story.

### **Activity Option 4 - Create a Collage to Represent the Book**

Your collage should have at least (10) photos or illustrations representing the story. Write a key that explains the relation of each item on the collage to the story.
