Stay Alert

Larceny from motor vehicles remain a problem in our area.

The majority of these occur between 10PM - 6AM and mostly because victims leave their cars unlocked.

Don't be a victim; keep your vehicles in the garage if at all possible, and if not, the driveway is second best. Make sure doors are locked at all times.

Don't leave anything of value in your car, including garage door openers, cell phones, chargers, and of course keys. Thieves don't want to be seen, so keep outside lights on to deter them from your approaching house and cars.

If you see anything or anyone suspicious, please do not post on social media, and instead call the non-emergency Police number and report it as soon as possible, at 303-627-3100.

In addition, please alert a board member so we can keep the neighborhood informed.

Republic Services
