Lk 17:5-10

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Be careful what you pray for! I am sure we've all heard that one before. I take it to mean that if we presume to know what is best for ourselves, and ask God for our wishes, then we better be fully prepared to accept with peace the outcome and result. Because? We asked for it. For example, have you ever ordered a food dish that sounded great, only to be disappointed by its bad taste or quality? I recently had a salad at an Italian restaurant in Louisville, and it sounded awesome on the menu with its unique ingredients (and new-flavor dressing). But, just my first bite made me feel like a safer order and better meal would have been simply basic lasagna! I couldn't tell if soured 'e.coli' was leaking out of the greens or it was the actual dressing added to them (I never figured out the source of that bitterest-sour taste?) But since I ordered it, I ate it and learned from it! And yes, I would go back, but next time I will order a tried and true traditional item! Or have you ever worked hard to get the latest gadget that you felt would make your life perfect, only to realize it doesn't deliver? Maybe it even complicated your life with more stress? I understand that to be what people mean when saying, "Be careful what you pray for." I hear a version of this when the apostles say to Jesus in the gospel today, "Increase our faith" (Luke 17:5). Do they know what they just asked for? To have increased faith means handling increased challenges. How else do you know you have stronger faith than to be challenged and found stronger by overcoming the test? I remember someone saying they asked for greater patience and then realized 'Oh no! Now I have to show that greater patience by tolerating more, forgiving & accepting more struggles'. Yes, like a weightlifter adding ten more pounds to his barbell, or a runner adding a mile to her distance, the apostles are asking for a tougher climb with their request for stronger faith. St Paul describes this process in Romans 5:3-4, outlining how trials increase faith naturally. He says, "We even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance produces proven character, and proven character produces hope." However, being ever-ready to rise to all challenges, doesn't mean that we recklessly seek out extreme-added burdens. But we do welcome any opportunity that comes along to express our faith and witness to Christ. Several weeks ago, our gospel reading had Jesus lay out what worthy disciples should be willing to accept. Jesus said disciples 'deny themselves daily, take up their cross and follow me" (Luke 9:23). And what happens with such willing acceptance of challenges? He says that even with "faith only the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you" (Luke 17:6). Amazing, for sure, yet, with Christ the amazement never ends! I wonder which is more astonishing? 1)The mulberry tree alive and growing in the sea? Or 2)A settled tree uprooted and relocated just by telling it to, 'move' (maybe like just pressing the red 'easy' button from Staples' commercials). Yet, even just a simple faith in Christ can accomplish such impressive actions. With Christ, there is great power in little things. I find Jesus to mean that any amount of expressed faith grows with practice and time. The underlying principle is 'patience' and 'surrender'! Imagine the power of little things? Last century, the whole world saw the immense explosive power of a tiny atom being split. But closer to home, have you ever watched a small seed, then become a little sapling that grows right up beside a house and even moves the foundation? Over time, that seed roots and grows, eventually shifting and breaking the foundation. Or how about weeds growing in a sidewalk crack that break up the concrete sidewalk as they grow? Or even the simple flow of water over rock that gradually wears down the stone and makes a channel path through bedrock? Patient faith releases a similar power. Even a small expression of faith, wisely given time, will move trees and have them grow in water (Jesus says this even before the big green movement of 'hydroponic farming'!- I once lived near a farm of Mennonite neighbors who had a 'hydroponic' business growing some pretty tasty tomatoes all-year round.) So, keep the Faith, and patiently hold the long view!

The following words may seem off topic, but I think they fit in well with the gospel today about rising to challenges and expressing faith 'in season and out of season' as St Paul tells us in 2 Timothy 4:2. We all know it is easy to practice faith when everybody is doing it, but it is 'seasoned' true faith when no one else is doing it! News accounts and surveys indicate that national church attendance, contributions and involvement in programs are dropping. Much is in the news recently about the sins/crimes of bishops and priests. This has given many people reasons to be discouraged about publicly practicing their faith. The corruption among the clergy and the example of poor shepherding within our leadership has caused immense hurt. Pastors hear the cries, and will continue the needed healing and reform. Yet, while the clergy is being purified, an often untold story is about so many deeply committed lay persons continuing their practice of the Catholic faith every day. They maintain their prayer and stay close to the sacraments. They do not let the sins of clergy hold back their ongoing practice of the Faith. That is the Holy Spirit among us, seeking to 'keep faith' and reform our church structures through the work of holiness. Our faith is in Christ Jesus, and He, our Shepherd, will carry the Church through these days of purification.


