From "What now?" to "What's next?" ----------- With Pastor Eric

While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." Luke 24:36 – Surprise!

"Therefore, <u>since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of</u> <u>witness</u>, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us," Hebrews 12:1 – Support!

What's next? I guess that is the question for this New Year's Eve? We have experienced many new things together over the course of 2021. You would think that with every curve ball thrown at me this year from the media, government, church, the medical sector, and family that I would be ready for anything, or at least recognize that truly anything is possible.

Well...I did not expect the worship service to go from the joy of Advent expectation to the joy of celebrating my 25th Anniversary of Ordination as a Pastor. I was full of shock, surprise and at the time some mixed emotions. I embarrassed myself by the utter lack of awareness in my own mind at such a wonderful deception. Throughout the year I thought tirelessly about the congregation's health and well-being...how to keep people engaged, encouraged, and included with a sense of concern for safety. I realized something important along the way-that it takes a team, family, and a village to get through the tough stuff and respond to the surprises that come up again and again. Some people refer to surprises as life smash-ups. I believe that surprises are key times when God comes really close whether perceived as positive or negative. Surprises are the growing edges of faith and life. I learn more about myself and my relationships when I get surprised.

At my 25th Anniversary of Ordination worship, I was utterly surprised, and Brad looked at me in the moment and asked, "Do you trust me?" I replied, "Yes, of course!" We need to trust people in our life and cultivate those relationships to lean upon with trust amid surprises. We need to be grateful for everything and everyone at those moments because it is when we are surprised by life that we realize "who we are" and "whose we are." We realize what is important and who is important to us. We need surprises to grow as human beings and live into our potential with God

I am not sure what 2022 will bring for the congregation or for me and my family. I do know this for a fact...that surprises will abound...and God is with me through them...and other people will be with me as well. Thank you again for the wonderful surprise! You are beloved to me always! Have a blessed 2022!

Entrepreneurship, Food, and Welcoming

In 2006, Ali and her family traveled from Kenya and resettled in the U.S. They found themselves in an unfamiliar place: Iowa. But today, they still call Iowa home, thanks to the community they built and the support they received while resettling in the U.S. LSI Refugee and Immigrant Services helped the family become comfortable and confident living in their new community.

"They taught us to shop, register for school – all the basic needs. Even winter shopping for the Iowa weather," Ali says. "They taught us how to get by. It was nice to help us get settled in."

After some time in Iowa, Ali and her husband, Salah, decided they wanted to open a restaurant as successful as the one they had in Kenya. They soon realized how challenging this would be – the biggest obstacle being the financial burden of opening a restaurant in the Des Moines area. After 15 years of never giving up on their goals, they were able to open Gursha Ethiopian Grill.

Opening during a pandemic, when other restaurants in the industry struggled to remain open, has come with its share of obstacles. But thanks to community support, the restaurant is a popular destination in the area.

Ali dreams of one day franchising to other locations. With their continuously growing clientele and delicious food, this goal is not far away.
