I am pleased to announce this year's BMW scheduled for Friday, May 12, 2017 from 0900-1630 at the Duval Conference Center at the Holiday Inn Hotel & Suites, 521 S. Gulfview Boulevard, Clearwater Beach, Florida 33767 USA. NOAA, as lead for the U.S. Search and Rescue Satelite-Aided Tracking (SARSAT) Program, will Chair this year's meeting. As in years past, the workshop is a part of the Radio Technical Committee for Maritime Services (RTCM) Annual Meeting. We thank the RTCM for their support and the opportunity to host the workshop.

The purpose of the workshop is to provide an open forum with the organizations that manufacture, market and service emergency beacons. As a representative of your industry, you will be given the opportunity to freely discuss issues that affect you and your customers with officials from the Federal Government who manage and operate the Cospas-Sarsat System. The workshop also allows the government officials to consider input from industry representatives before making decisions pertaining to the system.
