- 1/2 cup red onions -chopped
- 2/3 cup golden raisins
- 1/2 cup slivered almonds
- Dressing: 1 cup mayo (low fat, if desired)
- 1 t white vinegar
- 1/4 cup sugar
- Mix dressing with the broccoli mixture

CREAMY SQUASH SOUP

- 2 butternut squash, seeded, peeled and cubed (can be precooked in microwave to soften)
- 1 cup chopped carrots
- 1 cup water
- 1/8 tsp cinnamon, nutmeg, curry powder OR tarragon leaves**
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 2 cans chicken broth
- 1/2 tsp ground pepper

In a large pot bring broth, water, squash and carrots to a boil. Cover and simmer for 15 mins or until vegetables are very tender. Let mixture cool slightly. Puree small amounts of cooked mixture in a blender or food processor until fully pureed. Stir in pepper and *spice* of your choice. Put sour cream in a separate bowl and stir in a few tablespoons of the hot soup until blended. Stir the sour cream mixture into the soup and serve. For extra creamy soup add a dollop of sour cream to individual servings.

INDIAN CORN CHOWDER

- 1 lb ground meat
 - 4 cans tomato soup
 - Salt
 - 2 cloves garlic
 - 2 cans stewed tomatoes
 - 1 or 2 onions, sliced
 - 4 cans kernel corn, drained
 - Pepper
 - Bay leaf
 - Few dashes Worcestershire sauce
- Brown meat and onions. In a large pot add all ingredients to meat and onion mixture, cook on medium for 30 mins.

EASY ARTICHOKE DIP

- 1 can artichoke hearts, drained and broken into pieces
- 1 cup mayo
- 1 clove garlic, mashed
- 1 cup parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 stick butter

Grease a casserole with butter, melt remaining butter. Mix artichokes, mayo, cheese, garlic and melted butter in a large bowl. Add mixture to casserole and cook at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Can be topped with fresh parsley and/or paprika. Serve hot with crackers.


