September BBQ

The Berks County Grange is doing a Chicken BBQ on Sunday, September 4 at Leesport Farmer's Market from 11am-2pm, this is Labor Day weekend. The meal will consist of a half chicken, baked potato, roll, applesauce, and a bottle of water. The chicken will be done on an open-pit charcoal grill done by Two Guys Chicken. Each meal will cost \$11. The Family Activities committee will be holding a bake sale and pepper cabbage will be available for purchase.



We are asking Grange members to sell tickets and we are offering the incentive of 1 free ticket for every 15 tickets sold. We know that it may be hard for members to sell tickets, because of the distance to Leesport. We are suggesting that you sell tickets, pick up the dinners, and then set up a time and location

closer to your customers. We did 550 dinners in 2020, let's see if we can do a 10% increase, for a total of 610. We will need a couple of coolers to hold the extra chickens and potatoes when Two Guys is done cooking everything. If you are able to help us with that, please let the committee know that.

AGRICULTURE REPORT by Doug Sattazahn

Did you know that you pay more for milk that is produced, processed and sold in PA? This is known as the Over Order Premium (OOP), which returns about 11 cents per gallon directly to PA farmers.

The OOP is administered by the PA Milk Marketing Board, a 3-person panel that oversees this and other regulatory functions of the milk industry in our state. This program came about decades ago to help farmers cope with a severe drought. It has been renewed ever sine at varying levels, depending on economic and other factors affecting dairy farmers. However, there is debate as to whether the OOP should be continued. Cooperatives are considered milk producers, and some absorb the OOP into their costs, sometimes not returning it to farmers in the process. Other people feel that PA milk is put at a disadvantage since out-of-state milk can be sold for a cheaper price in stores.

The Grange has been a steadfast proponent of the OOP and continues to support renewal of this assessment on PA milk. Recently, amidst much debate, Farm Bureau has adopted policy to set the OOP to O. Grange will likely be the only organization supporting the OOP at the next hearing. In my opinion, the OOP isn't perfect, but we don't have a better option currently. Stay

decided to have a county-wide Installation of Officers at the September 10 quarterly meeting. The regular meeting will begin at 9:30 am in the Fleetwood Grange hall. POMONA LOTTERY CALENDAR 2023

It was discussed and decided at the June Pomona meeting that we should do another Pomona Lottery Calendar for 2023 as a fundraiser! As of now, the forms have been sent to the Berks County Treasurer's Office for the lottery calendar permit numbers.

FUND-RAISER with OLEY FAIR

The Berks County Pomona Grange eliminated the Pomona Sale and now needs to find ways to fund our projects for Community Service concerns as well as keep up with our regular expenses throughout the year.

The Oley Fair Board felt our Pomona could provide staff to man the SOUP STAND (Vegetable and Chicken Noodle) during the fair. We manned this stand last year and will again this year. Fair dates are September 15. 16, and 17, 2022.

What does the County Grange get out of this? We will receive monetary contribution from the Olev Fair.

There will be a coordination of scheduling of volunteers from all our Subordinate

Granges in order to accomplish this task. Henry Seidel, Michael Adams, Fern Kulp and Nettie Kauffman will oversee this project. This committee is seeking HELP from each of you in order to properly run the soup stand during the fair. A time frame to help would be possibly 2 to 2-1/2 hour shifts each day of the fair and only so many volunteers can be accommodated on each shift. Beginning at 9 AM to 10-10:30 at night volunteers will be needed. If more volunteers sign up for a specific shift, they can be used elsewhere at the fair. The more volunteers helping (either in Soup Stand or elsewhere) will provide more sources of income for our organization.
