TO VOTE

What an interesting time we are living in! A new decade, a new impeachment trial impending, and a

time of increased division, unease and distrust of those not like us, and an upcoming chance to be the first in the nation to support the candidate of your choice at the caucuses (you can be of either party or independent to participate – but you will have to register democrat to support one of the candidates for the next nominee since there are no contests in the republican party).

I've listened to the reasons over 80% of evangelical voters cast their votes for the current president, and they are passionate in their support. I've listened to the debates in the house for impeachment, and I'll probably watch again when the senate takes up the charge. Unfortunately, there was too much power in the Roman rulers to let it happen. But if we truly want peaceful change, we will have to start with ourselves. What is my attitude toward those I don't like because of their positions on the poor, immigrants, healthcare? Am I willing to engage in conversation with those in opposition to my choice of leadership, understanding that peace can only come through cooperation? Because peace doesn't begin with the government, it begins with each one of us.

So go caucus if you can, support the candidate of your choice, and then start conversations with family, friends, neighbors – even strangers – and search for common ground – love, justice, cooperation, hope, and peace. It takes courage and willingness to be open to other's opinions if we are to prevent a world filled with hatred. Wishing you Light and Peace in 2020! Pastor Sue

Favorite Meeting Recipes

French Toast Casserole By Hilda Bowers

Ingredients:

- 1 Cup Brown Sugar
- ½ Cup butter
- 1 (8 oz) loaf crusty French Bread, cut into bite size pieces
- 2 Cups milk
- 6 eggs
- 2 t. vanilla
- l pinch ground cinnamon, (or to taste)
- l T. brown sugar

Directions:

- 1. Grease a 9x12 inch baking dish
- 2. Stir 1 cup brown sugar and butter together in a saucepan over medium heat until butter melts and sugar dissolves into butter, two to four minutes. Pour into prepared baking dish and spread a $1 \frac{1}{2}$ 2 inch layer of bread over the top.
- 3. Beat eggs, milk, and vanilla extract together in a bowl. Pour milk mixture over bread in the baking dish, making sure all bread is absorbing milk. Sprinkle cinnamon over the top, cover with plastic wrap, and refrigerate 8 hours –overnight.
- 4. Preheat oven to 450 degrees; remove the plastic wrap and sprinkle brown sugar over the top.
- 5. Bake in preheated oven until brown and bubbling, about 30 minutes.

(This was a popular choice at our Christmas Past free breakfast. The recipe says to consider adding additional ingredients such as blueberries, cream cheese, cinnamon apples, dried fruit, or nuts. SMc)



Ramallah Friends School Celebrates 150 Years



Celebrations of the 150th anniversary of the Ramallah Friends School culminated this weekend in a Gala Dinner. Friends there wrote about the experience on their website:

On the eve of December 6th, 2019, about 300 RFS community members came together for the final event of the School's 150th anniversary celebrations, RFS's first Gala Dinner. The dinner was organized by RFS' Communications Department, and attended by alumni, parents, staff, RFS friends, and Quakers.

Friends United Meeting General Secretary Kelly Kellum commenced the event with a period of silence, a Quaker tradition RFS has always held dear. In addition to Kellum, FUM staff members Eden Grace and Andy Albertini, along with FUM Presiding Clerk Ron Bryan, flew from the United States to attend the event, joining the local community in celebration—and fundraising.

All proceeds from the Gala dinner will go into the student scholarship fund, in an effort to entice the local and public community to increase the percentage of RFS students receiving financial aid.

For the academic year of 2019-2020, almost 17% of the entire student body at RFS is receiving some form of financial aid. For the academic year of 2020-2021, RFS aims to increase that percentage.
