## August 2015 Block of the Month: Army Star

This makes a 12" finished block!
** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **
Color 1 (Blue on White) needs: one 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" strip
Color 2 (Red on White) needs:
one 2 " x 16" strip
Color 3 (Blue) needs:
one 4 " $\times 14$ " strip
Color 4 (White or Cream) needs:
one 3-1/2" x 14 " strip
Color 5 (Red) needs:

one 2 " x 14" strip AND
one 2" x 8" strip AND
one 3-1/2" square AND
one 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" strip
Start by marking and cutting the Color $22^{\prime \prime} \times 16^{\prime \prime}$ strip into eight 2" squares. Then mark and cut the Color 3 4" x 14" strip into eight $2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Next mark and cut the Color 4 $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ strip into four 3-1/2" squares. Mark and cut the Color 5 2" x 14" strip into four 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles. Mark and cut the Color $52^{\prime \prime}$ x 8" strip into four 2 " squares. Cut one Color 5 3-1/2" square. Mark and cut the Color 1 and Color 5 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" strips into two 3-7/8" squares each. Stack and cut these once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles of each. Sew the half square triangles together in pairs. Make four units like this. Press towards darker side. Trim to 3-1/2" square if needed.

Make flying geese units by placing a Color 2 2" square right sides together against one end of a Color 5 rectangle, with edges
aligned. On the back of the small square lightly draw in the diagonal, and then sew on this drawn line. Trim off the excess seam allowance, pressing the remainder towards the corner triangle. Repeat this with another small square on the other end of the rectangle. Make four units like this.

Sew the block's center unit by making three rows, using the Color 5 small squares, the flying geese units, and the Color 5 $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. To make the block's sides, sew the Color 3 rectangles to the sides of the Color $43-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Press seams towards rectangles. Make four units like this.

Now sew together all the units we have made into rows, alternating pressing directions by row. Sew the three rows together, measure and trim if needed, and you have a 12 1/2" Army Star!
