



- 1 st Nephi 2:5 The distance from Jerusalem to the shores of the Red Sea (modern day Agaba) is about 180 miles. On foot (traveling 11 miles/day) that would be a journey of about 16 days. On Camel (traveling 25 miles/day) that would be about 7+ days.
- 2 1st Nephi 2:6 The family continues their journey for three days past Agaba. On camels, that would be about 75 miles. A valley and river are found where the set camp. The only location fitting this 6 description between Agaba and a 100+ miles is a place called Al Beda, which lies 76 miles from Aqaba. This suggests the family 6 1st Nephi 17:1 – It has taken 8 years since they first left Jerusalem traveled via camel. We do not know how long the family stayed here, but while they were here they made two trips back to Jerusalem, had the vision of the tree of life, Jerusalem's fall, the great and abominable church, the Messiah's birth, and the sons all marry. It is probable that they were here for some time, perhaps years.
- 1st Nephi 16:13 They travel approx. 4 days, or 100 miles by Camel.

- The record says the place was called 'Shazer', which in Arabic means trees. It was quite possibly an oasis of sorts. The travelers stayed here for an unspecified time. Here they hunted and ate.
- 1st Nephi 16:14-15 The Family travels an approx. 280 miles or 11+ days on a Camel. They pitched their tents and began to hunt for food. It was here that Nephi breaks his bow.
- 1st Nephi 16:33-34 Ishmael dies and is buried in near by NHM or Nahum. This occurs after approx. 230 miles or 9+ days of travel.
- to get here. From Nahom it was about 560 miles or 22+ days on a camel (remember a Hebrew would never travel on the Sabbath so the number of days would have actually been longer). They arrived in a place they called 'Bountiful'. We learn, that along the way, they had children and endured great hardships. They arrived in the year 588 BCE
