Thankfully, Kent Johnson stepped in with his guitar and did a great job of leading us. We skipped the choir anthem, did a few things a little differently, and thoroughly enjoyed both the worship time and the fellowship. The weather and a lot of illness going around meant that we had as many folks on Zoom as we did in person. This was one of those days that we especially were thankful that folks can connect online, and the Zoom crew



seemed to be enjoying themselves as well.

As far as the meal goes, the Saucy Southerners from Hickory Park tasted every bit as good indoors as they would have in the front yard. Bonus: no flies and no late summer wasps.

It takes us a while to learn, and it seems like we have to keep re-learning it, but some things are beyond our control. Yet whatever happens, God always shows up. I look forward to seeing you this Sunday!

Toya Richards to Speak at FBC October 2

Rev. Toya Richards will be our guest preacher in worship on October 2. Rev. Richards has been approved as an ABC Global Servant and will serve in Cape Town, South Africa as a teacher and professor at the Cape Town Baptist Seminary (CTBS), a ministry of ABC partner the Baptist Union of Southern Africa. Before going in to ministry, Toya worked for 30 years in journalism and communications. Drawing on that extensive experience, she will teach intermediate to advanced English language skills and research methodology, preparing students to meet the demands and requirements needed for advanced seminary studies. She will also be involved in community justice initiatives through the CTBS Center for Biblical Justice.

Toya is a graduate of Western Kentucky University and Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. She most recently served as a pastor in Minneapolis. We are delighted to have her with us on World Communion Sunday!

First Baptist has a long history of supporting the CROP Walk for Hunger. In the CROP Walk, walkers are sponsored by church members and friends with proceeds going to fight hunger.
