We as a club are trying to cut down on expenses. We don't have as many paying members any more so we have less monies coming in. No Retreat to generate money and we haven't had a club show in a few years so no money being generated there.

All this is being done to keep our club up and running. Many clubs around us have fallen to the wayside and we want to keep ours alive.
