'Rules and Regulations'

- All applications to be in by last mail: Friday, 30th November, 2018. Only those students on 'class lists' will be permitted to perform.

Include contact and support details as well as 'class lists; for each section entered with correct monies to be deposited to the Administrators back account (*Please email Administrator for details*).

Please note:

Champions and Runners Up of each event are expected to perform in the Closing Ceremony on Friday 7th December at 6.00 – 7.30 pm. Trophies will be awarded there.

- Please note strict adherence to maximum numbers/time limits. Any performance over the number of participants or the time limit will be disqualified.
- Adjudicators decisions will be final and no correspondence/appeals at law will be entered into.
- Schools are required to have their own insurance cover for students on excursion.

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- All schools need to hold an APRA/AMCOS Licence in order to be eligible to perform. Authorised Copies are to be made available to the adjudicator prior to taking to the stage for performance. Such copies will not be returned according to APRA/AMCOS regulations.
- Only the teacher/conductor and/or accompanist is permitted on the stage.
- Each plaque won by a school will be engraved with the Music Games official title and the name of the event entered. Any other engraving is to be at the expense of the winners.
- Schools may enter only one (1) group of students per event per ‘class list’.
- **E.g. In the Choir Section:** Le Page PS can enter one group of students for the Years F – 2 event; one group of students for the Year 3 – 4 event, and one group of students for the Years 5 – 6 event plus students for the Whole School event, as well.
- **Accompaniment:** Any form of accompaniment may be utilised: Piano/Guitar and or backing track via USB or some other electronic device. An adult accompanist is permitted on stage in addition to the teacher / conductor. Please make sure they have WWCC and have been entered on the Responsible Person List.
- Any breach of the above rules and regulations may result in disqualification of an entry. Any other aspects of the Music Games not catered for herein shall be at the sole discretion of the Music Games Convenor.

Section Requirements

Choirs

2 contrasting songs. Time Limit: 12 mins (on & off stage) - Max 26 students per event.

Instrumental Ensembles

2 contrasting songs. Time Limit: 12 mins (on & off stage) - Max 26 students per event.

Solo Artists: Vocal

One song only, any language; accompanied or unaccompanied – backing track/instrumental (e.g. Piano or Guitar) - Time Limit: 6 mins (on & off stage) Max 5 students per event.

Solo Artists: Instrumental

One piece only; accompanied or unaccompanied – backing track/piano
Time Limit: 6 mins (on & off stage) Max 5 students per event).

Other Information

What is provided:

For Solo artists: 1 music stand (if required), sound system (1 microphone and USB input; single track only). Full size Electric Piano with one sustaining pedal.

For Instrumental Ensembles: Chairs (if required). (BYO music stands & music)

For Choirs: 'Flat' Stage only (for safety) Please adjust presentation accordingly
