"And Who Is My Neighbor?"

I lost my only brother in June 2012. I went home (Nigeria) for the burial and it was really a very difficult time. It was extra difficult because of the requirements that had to be met for the village and the parish to participate in his funeral and burial rites. I desperately needed help from my priest and religious friends - their presence and participation. Ironically, it was one priest that I never expected to show up that, not only showed up, but also became my backbone; while the one I expected, and actually asked to be there for me never showed up. It was sadly revealing.

In this week's gospel (Lk 10:25-37), we hear once more the familiar story of the Good Samaritan. He was the unexpected sinner who turned out to be the true believer - through his great act of kindness and practical love. The ones that professed their love for God and their neighbor, the ones supposed to actually spring into action became no-shows and empty gongs.

Looking back, I know I have failed others in the past, even after promising my love and support. Most probably, you've been there before too. And others have failed you too.

The first reading (Deuteronomy 10:10-14) is one of my favorites because it makes absolute sense and is so comforting, and challenging. We (human beings) mostly know what God requires of us. It is written in our hearts, right in the depth of our being. No one can claim that he/she does not know what to do. The problem, our biggest problem, is actually doing that which we know we ought to do.

One comment, a wonderful one, I've heard so much, is how St. Bart's is a parish where we care for one another. Every parish strives to be that to everyone who steps into their parish. I am proud of what you, Fr. Anthony, Fr. Daniel, and the previous pastors and their associates have accomplished over the years. I'm happy and excited that I'll be (or better, have become) part of such a caring community. More than that, because no one is perfect, and no parish is perfect, I look forward to ways we can continue to work with God to perfect the good work He is doing in and among us, as individuals, as families, and as a faith family.

Every priest comes into a parish with his unique gifts, talents and experiences, and of course weaknesses. I pray God will use mine (minus the weaknesses) to further His purpose for each of you, your families and the parish as a whole.

We're all on a spiritual journey to God. I desire to walk with each of you and with you as a parish, as best as I can. I hope you will walk with me too. Our goal: to grow closer to one another, to God and to home, that is heaven.

Let's take each other's hands and continue our journey of faith, and together we shall arrive at our home, and our joy will be complete. **Rev. Raphael Ezeh, MSP**


